My Mustang

Jeff ONeil's 1968 California Special (GT/CS) Mustang.



4,118 California Specials were built during the first part of 1968, from February through August. 251 of these were marketed in Denver as High Country Specials. My particular GT/CS was ordered in January 1968, built at the San Jose plant on

February 6, delivered to Starr Ford, Roseville,

CA, on February 19, and sold on April 15. (See the Marti Report below.)

Distinctive features of the California Special are:

- Shelby fiberglass trunk lid, quarter extensions, and 1965 Thunderbird tail lights.
- Pop-off gas cap.
- Side scoops.
- Chrome "california special" script located on the rear quarter panels.
- Body stripes.
- Blacked out grill.
- Fog lights.
- Quarter-turn hood locks.
- Only available on coupes.

I purchased the vehicle in March 2015, out of the San Francisco bay area. Ten years before I got the car, it was modified to include a Shelby front clip and hood, and repainted from the original Acapulco Blue to Wimbledon White with a Guardsman Blue LeMans stripe.

My initial intention was to refresh the car. As I got into it, I eventually decided to completely rebuild and modify it. Most of it, other than paint and body parts, has been replaced. I got carried away. I

did all of the work myself, except for welding the exhaust and building the engine. To date I estimate I've expended 1,500 hours on the car.

A car of this age might have a lot of rust, but this one mostly had surface rust. I stripped everything out of the car, removed body rust, and applied rust encapsulator to every surface that I could access. I installed Dynamat to all of these surfaces, including inside the doors, the floors, under the headliner, and the trunk.

The original drivetrain consisted of a 4-barrel high performance 302, C4 automatic transmission, and an open 3.00 8-inch differential. The car now has a port fuel injected 600hp 427 (SBF), built C4 transmission, overdrive unit, and a limited-slip 2.79 8-inch differential. 


