For the Love of Flying

Hazel was born in 1912 Portland, Oregon, when Chinese immigration to the United States was restricted and anti-Chinese sentiment was prevalent. Her parents had no idea their daughter would become an American hero.

One of eight children born to Chinese immigrants Yuet Lee and Ssiu Lan Lee, who met and married in the U.S., Hazel Ying Lee experienced a typical American youth enjoying swimming, handball, playing cards and learning to drive. After graduation from Commerce High School in 1929 she took a job as an elevator operator at a department store, one of the few jobs open to Chinese-American women.

However, at 19 her passion was ignited and her focus became flying after a plane ride in 1932. At a time when less than one percent of U.S. pilots were women, and despite opposition from her mother, Lee was so driven to fly that she saved money to take private lessons and earned her pilot's license later that year. Her sister Frances once said, "It was the thought of doing something she loved. {She} enjoyed the danger and doing something that was new to Chinese girls."



A year later, Lee traveled to China in hopes of joining the Chinese Air Force to oppose the

Japanese invasion. But they did not accept women pilots. She remained in China despite the war, working a military desk job for a time and flying occasionally for commercial companies.

She was in Canton when hundreds of civilians were killed in Japanese air attacks. Friends have spoken of Lee's calm while bombs fell all around and remember her effort to find shelter for friends, neighbors and family. Following another unsuccessful effort to join the Chinese Air Force, Lee returned to the U.S. in 1938.

After the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor, America was drawn into World War II and it became clear there were not enough pilots to sustain the war effort. In the fall of 1942, Lee heard about and applied for the Women's Flying Training Detachment - which in 1943 became the Women's Airforce Service Pilots (WASP).

She was accepted into the 4th class and became the first Chinese-American woman to fly for the U.S. military. During an arduous six-month training program in Texas, Lee learned to fly a variety of military planes. After graduation she was assigned to the 3rd Ferrying Squadron at Romulus Army Air Base in Michigan. They delivered aircraft, being manufactured in converted automobile factories, to points of embarkation, where the aircraft would then be shipped to the European and Pacific war fronts. In a letter to her sister, Lee described Romulus as "a 7-day workweek, with little time off." When asked to describe Lee's attitude, a fellow member of the WASP summed it up in Lee's own words, "I'll take and deliver anything."

Lee flew various aircraft including the Boeing C-47 which could transport up to 6,000 pounds of cargo. In 1944, she attended Pursuit School, becoming one of a select group of women qualified to fly high-powered.

single-engine, fighter aircraft, including the P-51 Mustang.

Known for her humor, Lee had a marvelous sense of mischief. She used her lipstick to inscribe Chinese characters on the tail of her plane and the planes of her fellow pilots. One fellow who happened to be a bit on the chubby side, had his plane dubbed (unknown to him) "Fat Ass."

Described by fellow pilots as "calm and fearless," one of Lee's two forced landings took place in a Kansas wheat field. A farmer, pitchfork in hand, chased her around the plane while shouting to his neighbors that the Japanese had invaded Kansas. "Flying" is continued on page 3

Veteran ID Cards now available

All veterans - past, present, and future - can now prove their military service without the added risk of identity theft. Millions of veterans have been unable to document their service without carrying around official military records.

These ID cards will make life a little bit easier for our veterans and serve as a constant reminder that our brave men and women in uniform deserve all the care and respect a grateful nation can offer.

The ID cards are meant to offer a way for veterans to prove their service without carrying a copy of their DD-214 forms, which contains sensitive personal information.

The new IDs will not, however, qualify as official government-issued identification for air travel or other uses. The ID card program is voluntary.

To request an ID, veterans must visit the "Vets.Gov" website, click on "Apply for Printed Veteran ID Card" at the bottom left of the page and sign in or create an account.

Alternately running and ducking under the aircraft wing, Lee finally stood her ground, told the farmer who she was and demanded he put the pitchfork down. He complied, and then complemented the landing she made.

Although flying under military command, the 1000+ women pilots of WASP were classified as civilians. On average, they were paid less than men; they had to pay for their own uniforms as well as their own room and board, and they did not receive military benefits. In fact, for the 38 WASPs who died in the line of duty, the U.S. Air Force did not pay for funeral expenses.

Sadly, Lee became one of the 38 in 1944 when she died as a result of injuries sustained in a runway collision.

In 1977, WASPs finally won veteran status and in 2010 President Barack Obama awarded WASPs the Congressional Gold Medal.

Military Women Across the Nation College Scholarship Rules & Application



This \$1,000 scholarship is available to a relative - male or female - of a military woman.

The 2018 essay topic is "Moms Serving in the Military: The Challenges They Face."

PLEASE FOLLOW THE RULES

Previous applicants have been disqualified simply because they did not follow the rules.

Applicant Eligibility

- 1. Applicants may be female or male but must be a civilian relative of a Military Woman who has served or is serving honorably in the U.S. Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force or Coast Guard or their Guard or Reserve components. The relationship may be by birth, legal adoption or marriage.
- 2. Applicants must have a 3.2 or better Grade Point Average (GPA) on a 4.0 scale.
- 3. Applicants must be a high school senior or undergraduate college student.
- 4. Entries must be submitted by March 2, 2018: NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 5. This scholarship is **NOT for military women or veterans**.

Application Package MUST INCLUDE the following:

- 1. Completed Application.
- 2. Copy of all transcripts pertaining to current course of study to include academic standing.
- 3. **Documented Proof of the military woman relative's honorable military service**. Application packages without this proof **WILL NOT be considered**. **Documented Proof** is a legible copy of the military woman's Standard Form DD-214 discharge certificate **OR** a Statement of Service on letterhead from an Active Serving military woman's command.

NOTE: To protect personal information applicants are directed to mark out all references to social security and/or service numbers on the DD-214 and high school or college transcripts.

- 4. An essay of 1,000 to 1,500 words in length written on the 2018 topic. The essay must be the applicants own work; be submitted in .doc or .docx format, and include documented evidence of both research and an interview with at least one military woman. (The interviewee does not need to be the qualifying relative.) Applicants are encouraged to contact military women in recruiting offices, at military bases, reserve units, etc. to enhance the research.
- 5. The entire Application Package shall be submitted in one email to include separate attachments for the following:
 - (1) Completed Application
 - (2) Transcripts (must be legible)
 - (3) Military Woman Relative Proof of Eligibility
 - (4) Applicant's essay (in .doc or .docx format)

Each attached file must include the applicant's last name and first initial as part of the file name and ALL correspondence must include the applicant's name in the subject line.

Application Package Submission DEADLINE is March 2, 2018

Applicants will be notified in June 2018 of the results.

The scholarship will be paid jointly to the scholarship recipient AND his/her college.
