

On Monday, April 2nd, Mrs. Stuckert braved the blizzard to meet Mrs. Ketterer from the Penn State Ag Extension here at HGA. What was so important? Why, it's time for the Embryology Program in 5th grade to begin! Embryology is the study of the beginning of life of any

living thing.

monitor and care for the 30 fertilized eggs in our class-room incubator. They will learn about each stage of development, the parts of the egg and how each part contributes to the growth of the embryo, as well as about the agriculture industry in the United States. Keep an eye out for our chick camera to be set up to await the hatching of our chicks sometime around the 19th of April.

MESSAGE FROM MR. LUCCHESE

Hi to all the HGA parents, friends, students, & faculty,

I first want to offer my sincere thanks for all the wonderful support, whether it be through prayer, cards, or thoughts. If you do not know exactly what happened, I was in a near fatal car accident on Thanksgiving. Through the grace of God, I survived, but shattered my left hip, pelvic bone and hand. I honestly had no idea how serious this accident was and the injuries it caused. I thank my excellent doctor for putting in 24 screws and rods to put me back together. Little did I know, that was just the beginning of my long road to recover.

After a month in the hospital and rehab facility, I was able to come home and begin the rigorous task of learning how to do the day-to-day tasks I once took for granted.

I went from using a walker to moving with a cane, which I am currently using to get around. I attend therapy three times a week to regain my strength in my leg and hip.

As of now, I am working on putting weight on my leg, and hopefully get rid of the cane and return to walking normally. There were countless times I got very aggravated and impatient, but with the help of everyone's inspiring cards and thoughts, I forced myself out of bed and worked as hard as I could. I am close to recover, but the therapy drains me and my strength, but from where I was, I am positive I will be back where I belong, in the classroom enjoying the students, faculty, and parents.

I cannot pinpoint an exact date that I will feel mentally and physically able to get to that point, but I am doing my best, and with all your positive thoughts and prayers, I am hoping it will be soon.

Thanks to all for your continued patience and a BIG thanks to Mr. Sterner for filling in for me so wonderfully! I don't have enough space to thank everyone who contributed to my road to recover, but the power of prayer has gotten me this far, so THANK YOU TO ALL! Take care and God bless!
