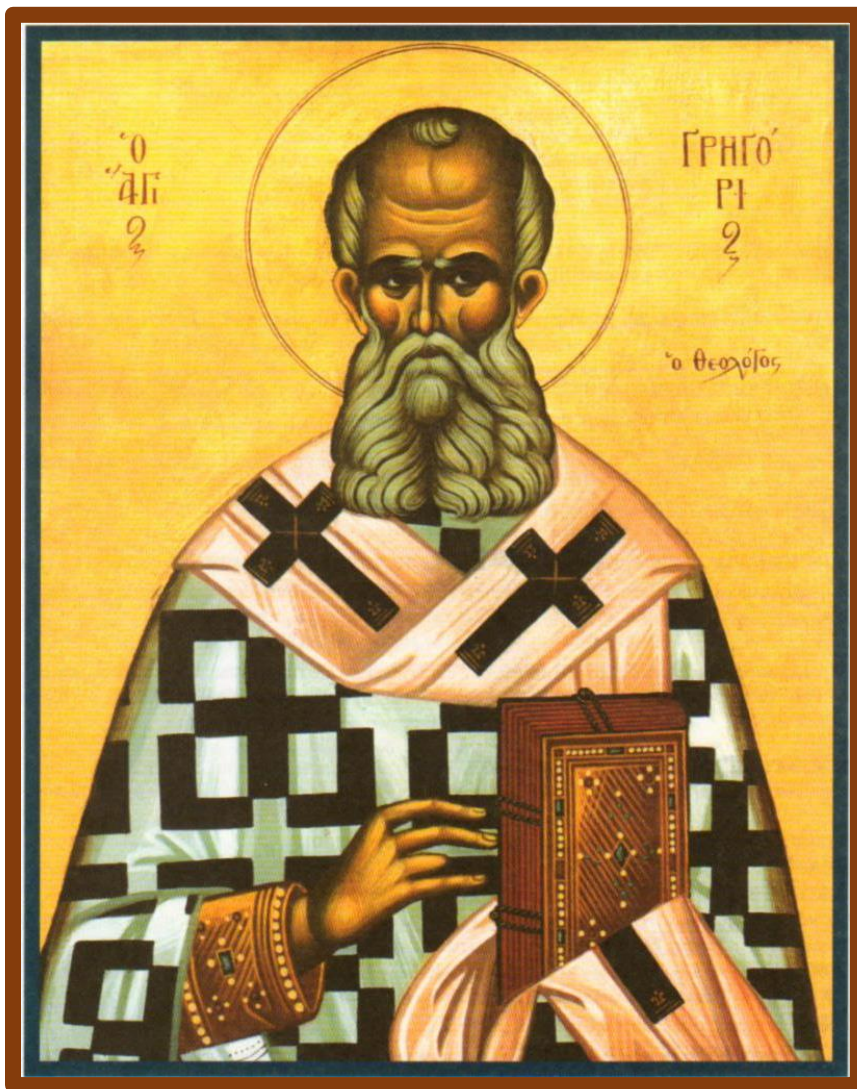

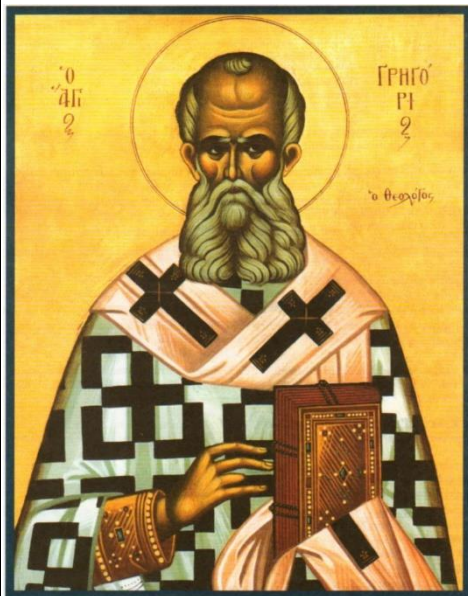

Saint Gregory the Theologian, Archbishop of Constantinople

February 7



Gregory was born in Nazianzus of a Greek father (who later became a Christian and a bishop) and a Christian mother. Before his baptism, he studied in Athens with Basil the Great and Julian the Apostate. Gregory often prophesied that Julian would become an apostate and a persecutor of the Church, and this actually happened. Gregory's good mother, Nonna, had an especially great influence on him. When he had completed his studies Gregory was baptized. St. Basil consecrated him as Bishop of

Sasima, and Emperor Theodosius the Great summoned him to fill the vacant archiepiscopal throne of Constantinople. He wrote numerous works, the most famous of which are those on theology, for which he is called the Theologian. Especially known, because of its depth, is his work *Homilies on the Holy Trinity*. Gregory wrote against the heretic Macedonius, who erroneously taught that the Holy Spirit is a creation of God. He also wrote against Apollinarius, who erroneously taught that Christ did not have a human soul, but that His divinity was in lieu of His soul. Additionally, Gregory wrote against Emperor Julian the Apostate, his one-time fellow student. In 381, when a debate began regarding his election as archbishop, he withdrew on his own and issued a statement: "Those who deprive us of our archiepiscopal throne cannot deprive us of God." Afterward he left Constantinople and went to Nazianzus, and there he lived a life of solitude and prayer, writing beneficial books. Although he was in poor health throughout his entire life, Gregory nevertheless lived to be eighty years old. His relics were later transferred to Rome. A reliquary containing his head reposes in the Cathedral of the Dormition in Moscow. He was, and remains, a great and wonderful light of the Orthodox Church, as much by his meekness and purity of character as by the unsurpassable depth of his mind. He reposed in the Lord in the year 390.

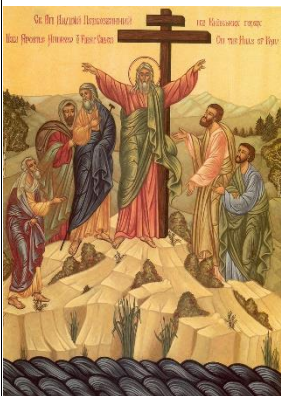

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St. Andrew Ukrainian Orthodox Society

Saint Andrew's Ukrainian Orthodox Society was founded in 1990 by the faithful of the Ukrainian Orthodox Church of the USA as a religious and charitable organization.

As an integral ministry of the Church, the Society's philanthropic mission focuses on providing humanitarian assistance to the needy and supporting church-related projects in Ukraine. Since its founding, the Society has raised over 1.3 million dollars towards the support of religious, educational and humanitarian projects.

Saint Andrew's Society Mission supports:

- the Christian spiritual rebirth of the Ukrainian people and reverse the consequences of Soviet militant atheism;
- the efforts of the Ukrainian Orthodox Church in re-establishing the universal principle of humanity, justice, charity and tolerance;
- the rebirth of the persecuted and devastated Church in the former Soviet Union.

Saint Andrew's Society fulfills its mission and vision by providing:

- humanitarian aid to the needy, the orphans, the elderly, and the refugees in Ukraine;
- financial and logistical assistance to seminaries in Ukraine and scholarships for theological students to study abroad;
- publications of religious literature, assistance towards medical projects and church restorations.

Humanitarian Aid

Saint Andrew's Society, with the assistance of faithful in Ukraine, provides aid to the needy and disenfranchised in Ukraine. This program, established early within the multifaceted ministries of the Society, provides hot meals, food staples and other living essentials to pensioners who have no family or social support and are of limited financial resources. Most recently, the Society began providing aid to refugees in Ukraine. Aid is provided in: Kyiv (3), Pereyaslav, Chernihiv, Ternopil, Chernivtsi, and Mariupol.





Soup Kitchen Program

Hot and nutritious meals are provided at cafeterias, churches or social service centers for the needy elderly. Over 4,000 meals are prepared and provided per month. These soup kitchens are staffed by volunteers in local communities or by church affiliated institutions and organizations.

Food Parcel Service

With the financial assistance from St. Andrew's Society, non-perishable food items containing dry and canned food products are purchased and packaged for delivery to the home-bound elderly or picked up at distribution centers. This cost effective service is provided in several cities in Ukraine. This ministry provides sustenance to the elderly, and brings joy and comfort to those who never leave their homes.



Educational Support

Saint Andrew's Society provides financial support to seminaries and theology students in Ukraine. Financial support to qualifying students is made possible with the help of the Lewytzkyj Seminarian Scholarship Foundation, which was established in 1990 in memory of Very Rev. Dr. Wolodymyr and Halyna Lewytzkyj. Merit and needs-based scholarships are available to students in Ukraine and to those who wish to study abroad. Religious Support

The Society participates in the ongoing efforts of restoring and rebuilding churches after the collapse of the Soviet Union. Most notably was the rebuilding of St. Michael's Cathedral in Kyiv in the 1990's, in which the Society financed the reconstruction and research towards the return of stolen mosaics.

The Society publishes and distributes Bibles and various other liturgical and educational publications to the faithful. The Society also supports individual parish ministries in Ukraine.

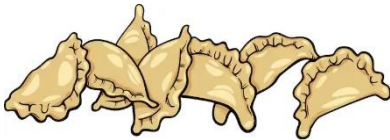
