Clear Creek Amana High School senior William Zuber enjoys his job as a guide at the Amana Heritage Museum in Amana.

On Sunday, July 10, a tour group came to the museum in Amana where Zuber was manning the front desk in the schoolhouse building. A middle-aged woman entered the schoolhouse bookstore at the Amana Heritage Museum and took a look around, stopping at the pre-1932 photo of middle-aged colony woman that hangs above the door in the schoolhouse that leads to the auditorium.

She paused, stared at the photo, and then turned to Zuber asking, "Is that Amanda?"

Zuber, wondering what she meant, asked politely, "Who?"

"Is that Amanda?" the lady said.

"Amanda?" Zuber responded.

"You know, Amanda! The founder of the Amanda Colonies."

Keeping a straight face, Zuber answered as best as he could though other members of the tour were standing ready to be admitted to the museum. "I'm not really sure she got it," he reported.

CCA Bond Issue Vote will be Sept. 12

Voters in the Clear Creek Amana School District will be asked to decide upon a \$35.6 million general obligation bond referendum on the ballot Tuesday, September 12.

A 60 percent majority of "yes" voters is needed to pass the measure which would authorize borrowing money to fund the construction of a new elementary school near Tiffin Elementary. That school would open in 2019. The bond measure would also pay for an addition to the CCA High School, more parking at the high school, security upgrades at North Bend, Clear Creek and Amana Elementary Schools, among other building upgrades. The project also includes a larger gym at Clear Creek (Oxford) Elementary.

An informational meeting was held Tuesday night at the Amana Elementary. While this meeting occurred after the deadline for this column, News and Notes exchanged emails with CCA Superintendent Tim Kuehl Tuesday who was happy to answer a few questions.

To learn more about the facilities plan and the bond issue, check out Superintendent Kuehl's blog at timkuehlcca.blogspot.com. Another public meeting on the bond measure will be held on August 7 at the North Bend Elementary School.

The CCA School District Board decided to place the measure to a vote September 12 after hearing the findings from a district facilities review committee. As proposed the bond issue would pay for:

- New Elementary School construction \$21,200,000
- CCA High addition \$7,410,000
- CCA High parking area \$2,546,000
- Amana Elementary air condition gym and other areas \$375,000
- Amana Elementary security, remodeling of entrance \$35,000
- Clear Creek (Oxford) Elementary gym \$3,324,000
 Clear Creek Elementary - ADA improvements
- Clear Creek Elementary ADA improvements \$310,000
- Clear Creek Elementary kitchen / café \$170,000
- Clear Creek Elementary security \$35,000
- North Bend Elementary security \$18,000
- Middle School access drive \$212,000
 Total \$35.646,000

Kuehl stated that the bond issue is "tax neutral." Tax rates are not projected to go up should the measure pass. Kuehl explained, "What I try to convey is that while the rate of the district will not go up, valuation in the district continue to climb, so patrons' (property tax) bills are likely to increase. The district rate did increase for 2016-2017 due to the need for the cash reserve levy."

The reason for the bond measure is increased enrollment. Exact figures are highlighted on Kuehl's blog. As he stated in an email to this reporter, "North Bend Elementary is over instructional capacity for this year, Tiffin Elementary will be very soon. Even utilizing Clear Creek and Amana Elementary fully, projections put the elementary over capacity in 2021."
