Conversion of North & South America to Christianity **Part 3**
George Washington



About a century later, war was raging with the British and the French. The Americans sided with the British,

the Indians, with the French. One thousand three hundred British and American troops were headed to Pittsburgh when, seven miles from their destination, they were ambushed by the French and Indians, hidden in trees, behind logs and in the brush. The British and Americans reacted according to their form of European warfare. They lined up and began to shoot back. The French and Indians slaughtered the British and American forces. Seven hundred and fourteen men were killed and, out of eighty-six American and British officers, only one remained on a horse. After two hours, they retreated, completely defeated. Few casualties were suffered on the part of the French and Indian forces.

The only officer left on his horse was a 23 year old, who the next day wrote to his mother and brother describing the event. Part of what he



and if we could kill you we could scatter your men. So I told my braves to single you out and fire at you. I personally shot at you seventeen different times. When we saw that the bullets were having no effect on you, I told my braves to stop shooting at you. I came all this way to meet the man God would not let die in battle."

Indeed, the hand of God was on this young officer, and he believed deeply in God and His Providence. He was George Washington, the future father of our country. While many historians and professors are doing their best to rewrite history, it is plain to see by Washington, through his letters and records how deeply he believed the Almighty led and built this nation. He believed its purpose was to be a Christian nation and all of the laws would be based upon biblical foundations; to do otherwise would lead to ruin. Washington represented unity. Uniting the colonies through Washington's authority, gave birth to the "union." Henry Knox said it was Washington's character, and not the recently signed Constitution, that held the Union together.

Washington was not a Catholic and because of this one might think, "So he was there at the beginning of our country. What did Our Lady have to do with that?" It was by a thin thread that the following information was passed on to us here and also a wonder, as it could easily have been lost forever.

No to warring among ourselves-Contd.

100. Those wounded by historical divisions find it difficult to accept our invitation to forgiveness and reconciliation, since they think that we are ignoring their pain or are asking them to give up their memory and ideals. But if they see the witness of authentically fraternal and reconciled communities, they will find that witness luminous and attractive. It always pains me greatly to discover how some Christian communities, and even consecrated persons, can tolerate different forms of enmity, division, calumny, defamation, vendetta, jealousy and the desire to impose certain ideas at all costs, even to persecutions which appear as veritable

witch hunts. Whom are we going to evangelize if this is the way we act?

101. Let us ask the Lord to help us understand the law of love. How good it is to have this law! How much good it does us to love one another, in spite of everything. Yes, in spite of everything! Saint Paul's exhortation is directed to each of us: "Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good" (*Rom 12:21*). And again: "Let us not grow weary in doing what is right" (*Gal 6:9*). We all have our likes and dislikes, and perhaps at this very moment we are angry with someone. At least let us say to the Lord: "Lord, I am angry with this person, with that person. I pray to you for him and for her". To pray for a person with whom I am irritated is a beautiful step forward in love, and an act of evangelization. Let us do it today! Let us not allow ourselves to be robbed of the ideal of fraternal love!

Other ecclesial challenges

102. Lay people are, put simply, the vast majority of the people of God. The minority – ordained ministers – are at their service. There has been a growing awareness of the identity and mission of the laity in the Church. We can count on many lay persons, although still not nearly enough, who have a deeply-rooted sense of community and great fidelity to the tasks of charity, catechesis and the celebration of the faith. At the same time, a clear awareness of this responsibility of the laity, grounded in their baptism and confirmation, does not appear in the same way in all places. In some cases, it is because lay persons have not been given the formation needed to take on important responsibilities. In

others, it is because in their particular Churches room has not been made for them to speak and to act, due to an excessive clericalism which keeps them away from decision-making. Even if many are now involved in the lay ministries, this involvement is not reflected in a greater penetration of Christian values in the social, political and economic sectors. It often remains tied to tasks within the Church, without a real commitment to applying the Gospel to the transformation of society. The formation of the laity and the evangelization of professional and intellectual life represent a significant pastoral challenge.

103. The Church acknowledges the indispensable contribution which women make to society through the sensitivity, intuition and other distinctive skill sets which they, more than men, tend to possess. I think, for example, of the special concern which women show to others, which finds a particular, even if not exclusive, expression in motherhood. I readily acknowledge that many women share pastoral responsibilities with priests, helping to guide people, families and groups and offering new contributions to theological reflection. But we need to create still broader opportunities for a more incisive female presence in the Church. Because "the feminine genius is needed in all expressions in the life of society, the presence of women must also be guaranteed in the workplace" and in the various other settings where important decisions are made, both in the Church and in social structures. *NEXT Month - Part 29*

steadily, vacantly at my unknown visitor. Gradually the surrounding atmosphere filled with sensations and grew luminous. Everything round about me seemed to rarefy, the mysterious visitor, herself becoming more airy and yet more distinct to my sight than before. I now began to feel as one dying, rather to experience the sensation which I have sometimes imagined accompanies dissolution. I did not think, I did not reason, I did not move. All alike were impossible. I was conscious only of gazing fixedly, vacantly, at my companion."

"Presently I heard a voice say, 'Son of the Republic, look and learn!' while at the time my visitor extended her arm eastwardly. I looked and beheld a heavy white vapor rising, at some distance, fold upon fold. This gradually dissipated, and I looked upon a strange scene. Before me lay spread out in one vast plane all the countries of the world – Europe, Asia, Africa and America. I saw rolling and tossing between Europe and America, the billows of the Atlantic Ocean, and between Asia and America lay the Pacific. 'Son of the Republic,' said the mysterious voice as before, 'Look and learn.'"

"At that moment I beheld a dark, shadowy being, like an angel, standing, or rather floating in mid air between Europe and America. Dipping water out of the ocean with his right hand, he cast it upon America, while that in his left hand went upon the European countries. Immediately a cloud arose from these countries and joined in mid ocean. For awhile it remained stationary, and then it moved slowly westward until it enveloped America in its folds. Sharp flashes of lightning gleamed through at intervals; and I heard the smothered groans of the American people. A second time the angel

 real. It was told by Anthony Sherman in 1859 to Wesley Bradshaw and originally published in the National Tribune, Vol 4, #12, December 1880. Perhaps it has been preserved all this time so that it may become known during the time of Our Lady's apparitions in Medjugorje.

Was Washington's life preserved by God for special plans of Our Lady?

The last time I saw Anthony Sherman was on the Fourth of July, 1859, in Independence Square. He was ninety-nine years old and becoming feeble. But though so old, his dreaming eyes rekindled as he gazed up at Independence Hall, which he came to visit once more.

"Let us go into the hall," he said. "I want to tell you an incident in Washington's life – one which no one knows except myself; and, if you live, you before long, see it verified."

"From the opening of the Revolution we experienced all phases of fortune, now good and now ill, one time victorious and another time conquered. The darkest period we had, I think, was when Washington after several reverses, retreated to Valley Forge, where he resolved to pass the winter of 1777. Ah! I have often seen the tears course down our dear commander's careworn cheeks, as he would be conversing with confidential officers about the condition of his poor soldiers. You have doubtless heard the story of Washington's going to the thicket to pray. Well, it was not only true, but he used often to pray in secret for aid and comfort from God, the interposition of whose divine

Providence brought us safely through the darkest days of tribulation."

needed a 2nd open heart surgery, but the surgery she needed had never been performed before - ever. It appeared that the doctors were concerned that the scar tissue from her cancer surgery and the treatments may not allow them to get to her heart. She had to make a decision to "chance" an unknown surgery or take medicine and just sit and wait until her heart just stopped altogether. She called me in a panic and said that she would NOT get the surgery as her daughter (my Godchild) would be getting married in December and she was afraid of the alternative. It bothered me that she opted out of the surgery and decided to "take her chances" until the wedding - 5 months away!

I thought to myself, "The Power of the Porch," the place where Mary stood! That would take care of this situation! So, we prayed for her while touching the porch where the Blessed Mother stood.

Within a couple of days after returning from the Mass site, my cousin called to tell me that she had changed her mind and that she would take her chances on getting the surgery. If the doctors could not get to her heart because of the thick scar tissue

then her time would be fairly limited. She made up her mind to chance the surgery regardless.

So, pray on the porch - we did. Within the week, she had her surgery. The doctors were amazed that their biggest fear DID NOT EXIST. She hardly had ANY scar tissue in her chest, they repaired her heart problems and she was released 3 days later and is doing fine to this day!

ABOUT THE WATER The first time we got the water from the well it was a red rust color. My little boy asked why it was that color and I told him it's to remind us of Jesus' blood. After several days the particles settled and it became clear.

The second time we went to the site and got water - the same thing. It came out a red rust color, settled and became clear.

The third time we went, the water came out CRYSTAL CLEAR. We put it in the trunk and when we got home it had turned a dark red rust! Just the opposite of what had happened twice before!
