

PROPOSED TRAINING LEVELS

In an effort to break up the *REACT* training material "elephant" into manageable parts, we will be submitting the following stages of training levels to the Board of Directors for approval. However, we are looking for feedback from you, the members, to see if this would be a more practical approach for members tackling our training program. These progressive levels have the ICS/NIMS training built into each level, versus all at one time. Members will have completed the core training needed, at this time, to be eligible for deployment in a Disaster Relief Operation with *REACT* International Inc.®

Members do not have to limit themselves to one level of training, but can take any type of course(s) they may desire. The goal here was to break it up to a basic member/team of monitoring for emergency calls, a member/team seeking to be active in message handling to a member/team who wants to be considered for DRO deployment.

These courses were designed to be studied and tested by individual members and not in a group or Team setting. We check to ensure you membership is active and in good standing, send the study material. Once you are ready for the test, you email training for the testing link and take the test for that course. Once you successfully pass the test, we receive notification, print your certification and send it to you.

We also have material for SKYWARN spotter training and a technician class amateur radio study guide for those who may be interested. We are working on an "AuxCom" training module for entry level members to learn the basics of two-way radio, programming methods and the basics of getting on the air.



Trinidad and Tobago Carnival – REACTers In Action


