INTERNATIONAL MEETING OF THE CATECHUMENATE 2022

To mark the 50th anniversary of the promulgation of the *Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults*, the Institut Catholique de Paris is holding a hybrid physical and virtual conference from May 5-7, 2022, entitled *The RCIA at 50: Developments and Challenges*. When introduced, the RCIA was unprecedented drawing on well proven liturgical practices that had not been used for hundreds of years. Within five years of promulgation, the Church began to recognize the catechumenate as the inspiration for all catechesis.

Organizers of the conference feel the "50th anniversary ... offers an occasion to re-examine and deepen the reflection on this ritual and on the process of Christian initiation."

Major talks will be translated into English, and documents will be distributed to any registered participants. Currently, the planning committee is in the process of preparing workshops for English speaking North America. While the website does not offer an English version, once reached it can be translated using Google Translate. Cost is €110. Exploring our Faith

A DESIRE TO BE UNDERSTOOD

Today, in the Gospel according to John, we hear of the story of the woman caught in adultery. It reminds us that sin, turning away from God and acting against our own dignity and worth, is not an ending. Jesus' response to those who accuse the woman is more than a caution to us about making judgement of others. It is a profound lesson in divine mercy and forgiveness. As sinners, we are all unworthy to judge the sins of others. Jesus, the one without sin and thus our judge, offers us who are sinners, His mercy and forgiveness. Redeemed by Jesus' compassion, we, like the woman, are sent to sin no more and live in God's love and peace.

I learned at a young age that I should not be judgemental of others. especially without the knowledge of what truly has led to this behaviour. One day, I came home from school and told my mom about how mean some of my classmates were treating this one girl...."She stinks! I'm not sitting near her!" My mother, a nurse who was working part-time with Public Health, would help in wellness clinics, go to certain houses to help with healthcare/ assessments (going to a doctor at that time in Ontario cost money) and she told me she knew where this girl lived. She told me that even though there was water, there was no hot water where she lived so she couldn't have the nice, warm bath like I could; nor would her clothes (school uniform) have been washed in hot water or hung outside to dry in the clean, warm air. That was maybe why her hygiene wasn't as good. It wasn't her fault so no one should judge her or her appearance. Mom told me not to be like some of the others, reminded me that I should try to be a friend and show her kindness and never, ever judge others when we don't know their particular situation. This was a powerful lesson to me that I recalled when I read this week's gospel.



Pope Francis, in citing St. Augustine, said, "Once those who sought to stone the woman left, only Jesus and the woman remained: mercy with misery". In His eyes, 'that woman', that person, was what was of value. For Him, the sinner comes before the sin. I, you, each one of us, come first in the heart of God... before mistakes, rules, judgements, and our failures."

When Jesus forgave the woman, He did not excuse her sin or treat it lightly. Rather, He expected a change of heart - confession and repentance. In turn, He presented the woman with the opportunity to begin a new life. He saw her as valuable, precious, and worthy of love. In going and sinning no more, it meant being brought back into a relationship with God. This is available to all of us, too.

Thomas Merton said, "Every moment and every event of every man's life on earth, plants something in his soul." In a world that increasingly tells us that nothing matters, that we can be critical of someone's behaviour, looks, and lifestyle, these words remind us that everything matters infinitely. By not judging others without knowledge of the truth or by not thinking you are 'better' than others, you are saying to God, "I don't want to disappoint you. I want my actions to reveal the depth of my love for God and gratitude for the grace He gives us always. As we enter the last weeks toward our Easter celebration, let us take heart and appreciate the mercy and forgiveness we receive in our relationship with God.



Concepts of Moral Theology A Recipe for Life and Understanding An Introduction to Catholic Moral Teaching

Saint John Paul II, in his encyclical Veritas Splendor or The Splendor of Truth, explores moral theology. In his thorough and right thinking way, he recognizes that actions are morally right or wrong depending on whether they contribute to or detract from authentic human good. If only life were so simple. The good saintly Pope recognized that the world has been moving away from the church teachings, particularly in the question of morality, and wants to bring us back.



Throughout the last several weeks , we have been exploring the foundations of Catholic thought, and St. John Paul II reinforces these pillars of our faith. "At all times, but particularly in the last two centuries, the Popes, whether individually or together with the College of Bishops, have developed and proposed a moral teaching regarding the *many different spheres of human life*. In Christ's name and with his authority they have exhorted, passed judgment and explained. In their efforts on behalf of humanity, in fidelity to their mission, they have confirmed, supported and consoled. With the guarantee of assistance from the Spirit of truth they have contributed to a better understanding of moral demands in the areas of human sexuality, the family, and social, economic and political life. In the tradition of the Church and in the history of humanity, their teaching represents a constant deepening of knowledge with regard to morality." (The Splendor of Truth #4)

He continues to express the need to honour the teachings of the Magisterium, and the profound wisdom which is found in Natural Law. All in an effort to bring people closer to the Truth, who is Jesus Christ, "the true light that enlightens everyone" (*Jn* 1:9)"

Our studies have guided us to "move toward the good". Humanity has a natural desire to think and reason rightly. Sin will corrupt the process but with the guidance of the Church, with the gifts of the Holy Spirit, we can always get back on the right track.

Let us reflect on human life for a moment , recognizing the sanctity of this gift. Mt 5:21-22 reminds us that we should not kill but just being angry with our brother is enough to make us liable. Yet sometimes murder and death is inevitable. We honour the Martyrs who gave their lives for the glory of God, but also those who fought for justice and freedom in so many wars. Our ultimate good is to be with God. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states clearly "Human life is sacred because from its beginning it involves the creative action of God and it remains for ever in a special relationship with the Creator, who is its sole end. God alone is the Lord of life from its beginning until its end: no one can under any circumstance claim for himself the right directly to destroy an innocent human being." (CCC 2258)

Death is not the greatest challenge to our moral world. The Church also teaches of the importance of the dignity of the person. This is so much more complicated than just life or death. We are created in the image of God. We must never diminish a person. We are people of dignity, worthy of the respect due children of God. The world would have us value the dignity of a person by the value they bring to the community. The world judges harshly those who have "lost their dignity" through whatever misfortunes. The Roman Catholic Tradition believes that people have dignity simply because they are."Being in the image of God the human individual possesses the dignity of a person, who is not just something, but someone. He is capable of self-knowledge, of self-possession and of freely giving himself and entering into communion with other persons. And he is called by grace to a covenant with his Creator, to offer him a response of faith and love that no other creature can give in his stead."(CCC 357)

Another principle of Catholic moral theology is the human person as social and relational. We do not have some principles or morals which are public and everyone should be on board with and others which are private and personal. "Our moral lives shape us as a person, it is on target to say that there is no such thing as a private moral act." (The Essential Moral Handbook, pg 187) "No damage must be done to the *harmony between faith and life: the unity of the Church* is damaged not only by Christians who reject or distort the truths of faith but also by those who disregard the moral obligations to which they are called by the Gospel (cf. 1 *Cor* 5:9-13). The Apostles decisively rejected any separation between the commitment of the heart and the actions which express or prove it (cf. 1 *Jn* 2:3-6). And ever since Apostolic times the Church's Pastors have unambiguously condemned the behaviour of those who fostered division by their teaching or by their actions. 38(Veritas Splendor #26)

We are also called to love the Goodness of Creation. We are required to love and care for all that God created because He saw that it was good. This is essential in our understanding of bioethics and the sexual teachings of the Church


