A Message from Our Pastor

For all the negative things we have to say to ourselves, God has a positive response/promise for it:

1As a prisoner for the Lord, then, I urge you to live a life worthy of the calling you have received. 2Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. 3Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace. Ephesians 4:1-3 (New International Version)

Reforming Trinity

One of the great lessons (gifts) of the Reformation of the 16th Century was the principle that the church is a confessing movement. That is, that the church is ever in need of reform. The Spirit of that confessing movement is captured in the great hymn, "The Church of Christ in Every Age" (ELW # 729). The hymn says, "The church of Christ in every age, beset by change, but Spirit led, must claim and test its heritage and keep on rising from the dead."

Our congregation has been beset by change. It was deeply divided over a misunderstanding of the Bible and how God's law and Gospel function to bring the world Good News of salvation. Although this division has been painful, in light of this hymn, it is not something we need to fear nor is it unexpected. We are Spirit led. So I view the changes that have come over our community as reflective of a need to claim and test our heritage and once again rise from the dead as the Holy Spirit reforms us.

The first Spiritual step in reforming our congregation will be to come together as one. I have proposed that we go to one worship service each Sunday, rather than two, for this purpose. This proposal will be brought to the Congregation Council meeting on Tuesday, November 19. If affirmed, we would begin this new worship schedule on December 1, the first Sunday of the new church year. You are welcome to attend the Council meeting on November 19, for discussion and input. It begins at 7:30 p.m.

The other step in claiming our heritage is through Bible study. In our case, not a study of Biblical passages, but a study of the development of the book called the Bible itself. Specifically, how the Bible functions to bring us the Good News of salvation in Jesus Christ. Our primary focus will be on understanding the function of God's law as it relates to God's Gospel in fulfilling this purpose. We will offer this opportunity for reform on Thursday evenings, beginning November 7.

Your part in helping us reform the congregation is to be yourself, as inspired by this passage from 1 Corinthians 7:17: "let each of you lead the life that the Lord has assigned, to which God called you. This is my rule in all the churches". That passage has been beautifully captured in a new banner that adorns our chancel. Each time you see it remember what your contribution to reforming this ministry will be: be yourself! Lead the life God has assigned you!




