Boxwood Blight

Symptoms



Light brown circular spots with dark borders on leaves



Downy white fungal growth on underside of leaves



Stems may have black cankers or lesions that are rod or cigar shaped

If disease is suspected, alert your supervisor immediately or contact your local diagnostic laboratory to submit samples for confirmation.

Prevention

- Sanitize equipment and tools regularly
- Maintain adequate spacing between plants to promote air circulation
- Check crops at least every two weeks
- Look inside the body of the plant for symptoms
- Use new pots and media for host plant production
- Minimize leaf wetness to less than five hours per day
- Ensure that you are using a certified supplier
