# SAFETY INSPECTION

The following three pages were given to participants of the Model A Club of Long Island during a recent Safety Inspection Clinic. It took an inspection team of three experts four hours to inspect nine Model A's. No repair work was done; just an inspection. Car owners were asked to participate by removing spark plugs, work spark and throttle levers, and reassemble their cars.

This looks like a great opportunity for a workshop this fall when the weather is cooler.

• King Pin Play: None; Excessive (Should be no play)
• Shock Absorbers: Ok; Missing; Leaking; Links Loose
• Steering: Ok; Excessive Steering Wheel Play; Gearbox Loose;
Drag Link Loose
• Wheel Bearings: Excessive Play LF; RF; No Play LF; RF;
Need Replacement; Ok (Some play for thermal expansion)

#### Model A Safety Inspection Form Notes & Stuff Required

### **Cooling System**

- Original fans, 2 & 4 blade, are unacceptable because of propensity of blades cracking off.
- Radiator should be noticeably cooler to the touch at the bottom of the core.

# Carburetor Throttle – Does It Go Wide Open?

Bend

Preferable

Type of

Gauge

Bah Bid

SPARKLITE

- Disconnect throttle rods at steering column & carburetor
- Pull rod full forward while holding carburetor throttle wide open
- If rod end does not reach
  - Bend the Accelerator Assembly Arm until rod meets carburetor throttle
  - Or lengthen / get longer rod

Engine

#### Engine Compression Test – How To

- Remove spark plugs & shift into neutral
- Engine 50°F to 80°F
- Throttle lever wide open
- Install compression gauge
- Turn engine with starter until gauge pressure reading stops rising
- 5 psig variation between cylinders max
- Compression estimate = 14.7 atmospheric pressure times compression ratio: Example: 14.7 x 5.5 = 80.8 psig
- If low pressure, add 2-3 oz of motor oil & retest
   Pressure increase with oil indicates leakage thru piston rings / valves / head gasket / crack

# Ignition

#### Ignition Coil Hookup Tests

- Determines coil hookup beneficial to performance
  - Wear rubber gloves
- Pencil test difficult to distinguish flare vs spark
   Better Way
- Sparklite tester is simple to use
  - Illuminates to show right hookup
    Available from Model "A" parts suppliers

#### Model A Safety Inspection Form Notes & Stuff Required

#### **Suspension & Steering**

#### Wheels, Front – Diagnosing Worn King Pins

- Grab tire @ 12 O'clock & alternately push & pull to determine play, if any
- Have partner observe interface of spindle & axle
  - If spindle moves independently of axle, king pins & bushings are worn & need replacement
  - Eventually cause of wheel shimmy



#### Wheels, Front – Diagnosing Loose Wheel Bearings

- Grab each tire @
  3 O'clock & 9 O'clock
- Alternately push & pull
- Observe interface of drum
- & backing plate
  - Some independent movement is normal & set by adjustment of bearings
  - Adjust bearings to assure no excessive or inadequate play



# **Miscellaneous Stuff Needed**

- Hand cleaner
- Paper towels
- Copies of test forms
- Clipboards
- Pens
- Mirrors
- Flashlights
- Gloves, vinyl
- Compression tester
- 10" Adjustable wrench
- Sparklite tester

# Modus Operandi

- Reserve area for 6 static inspection stations
- One inspector & car owner at each station
- Inspector provides inspection sheet, clip board, pen, compression tester, Sparklite tester, mirror, flashlight & gloves
- Car owner provides adjustable wrench, paper towels, hand cleaner, gloves
- Vehicle remains static during inspection
- Car owner assist inspector
- Inspection sheet given to car owner
- No repair/maintenance work allowed on premises
- Car owner responsible for repairs & parts
