Sample Teacher Interview Questions

Reminders

The questions asked during the interview process should be prepared in advance and guided by the job description. They should be behavioral in nature: uncover past behavior to best predict future performance. Consider questions which address background, administrative and teaching experience, staff relationships, planning processes, curriculum understanding, child development, methods of teaching/learning, co-curricular activities, understanding of students, distinct characteristics of Lutheran ministry in congregations with schools, plans for continued education, etc.

Here are 13 sample questions a committee might ask prospective candidates. Spend time modifying, changing, adding or deleting from this list.

- 1. Why have you chosen the ministry of Lutheran education as a career?
- 2. How would you describe your teaching style?
- 3. How do you communicate with parents?
- 4. How have you built a climate in your classroom in which Christ is the center of all that is done and taught?
- 5. What activities have you initiated or helped to initiate to recruit new students?
- 6. What are some things you have done to communicate the strengths and the atmosphere of your school to the church and community?
- 7. How have you determined when curriculum needs to be re-examined? How do you proceed?
- 8. List several things that you have done that have resulted in the improvement of your professional skills?
- 9. How would people at your present school say that you model the Christian life and provide spiritual leadership for your students?
- 10. As you arrived at our facility, what was your first impression?
- 11. How have you gone about providing for individual differences of the children in your classroom? How is technology part of your solution?
- 12. Describe the relationship you value between yourself and your administrator. What have you done to establish and maintain a positive working relationship with your principal? With other faculty members?
- 13. What other areas of interest and experience do you have outside the classroom?
