## Supply list for Collage Open Workshop by Gina Krejsa

What you need depends on where you are in your project. The supply list is broken into three parts:

## **Stage 1 - Pattern Making**

- Image, enlarged to desired project size. Images can be enlarged using
   <u>www.blockposters.com</u> or Excel and printed on regular printer paper and taped together.

  You can also take an image to Staples or a printing store to be enlarged.
- Freezer Paper enough to make a full size pattern of your image (you may need to tape pieces together to accommodate for your project size).
- Sharpie Marker Suggest one thin and one thick, but bring what you have on hand or like to use.
- Pencil.
- Tape and Paper Scissors (if you need to tape together your printed image).
- Light box (optional) makes it easier to see your image through your freezer paper to make a transfer. You can also tape your pattern to a window with light coming through to trace.
- Clear Plastic Quilting Template (optional) some people like to make clear plastic templates for piece placement. <u>Amazon Clear Plastic Template</u>

## **Stage 2 - Piecing**

- Adhesive of your choice: Steam a Seam lite, Misty Fuse, or glue (whatever adhesive you prefer).
- Small iron, depending on how you like to work depending on which adhesive you are using.
- Pins, depending on how you like to work
- Small and Large Fabric Shears.
- Paper Scissors.
- Best Press or starch (optional)
- Slice scalpel (optional) <u>Amazon.com: Slice Scalpel, 1 Pack, Blade Automatically Retracts:</u> Industrial & Scientific
- Inks (optional) Inktense or other fabric inks can be applied at this stage if desired.
- Goddess Sheet or Teflon Applique Pressing Sheet (optional) to prevent adhesive from getting on your iron.
- Parchment Paper (optional).
- Background or Foundation Fabric You need a piece big enough to hold your full collage project size.
- Collage Fabric lots of small pieces scraps or pre-cuts like charm packs, layer cakes, jelly rolls

## Stage 3 - Thread and Quilting

- Sewing machine, in good work order, capable of sewing in free motion
- Batting and Backing 2 inches larger than your piece I use Warm and Natural
- Threads in a variety of colors to complement your piece (I use 40 or 50 wt top threads solids or variegated and 50 wt in bobbin but you know your machine best)
- Needle, I use 90/14 Topstitch
- Inks (optional) Inktense or other fabric inks can be applied at this stage if desired
