position and Brian Lindow has taken on the DreamVettes coordination.


Please have a look at the events calendar in this issue, where you will see some terrific activities our Social Convenor and others have arranged for us throughout the year.



We ordered food off the Hops House menu and Pres. Ken found eating his chicken wings a little challenging with his long flowing Blonde locks in his face!



Fabulous afternoon!!






Friday evening, Ontario Street in front of City Hall, will be closed off for exclusive Corvette parking from 6:00 pm to 9:00 pm.


