Call to Order 7:00 PM, Pledge of Allegiance, Roll Call.

1. Public Comments: None
2. Vote: to approve Consent Agenda
 - a. December 2020 General Operating Fund Budget Report and Financial Statements
 - b. Minutes from December 14, 2020 Regular Commission Meeting.
 - c. Cash Flow Report- Vice-Mayor

Motion: Commissioner Keim made a motion to approve the Consent Agenda.

Second: Vice Mayor Block seconded the motion.

Motion passed 4-0.

3. Commission/Staff Reports
 - a. Town Administrator- No Report this month.
 - b. Chief of Police- Chief Pruitt was absent, and Lt. Schultz provided an update for residents. Lt. Schultz said JIC PD has recently joined forces with Jupiter Marine Unit, FWC, PBSO Woodlands Unit (via All-Terrain Vehicle), and Tequesta PD to combat the issues at JILONA. Friday and Saturday evening, the team issued trespass warnings to persons and vessels. Lt. Schultz answered questions from Commissioners on the joint team. The Bureau of Land Management is funding the detail. Commissioner Keim asked if this detail could be accomplished via land, could the officers use a bullhorn and a zoom lens to read the vessel's registration.
 - c. Commissioners: No reports
 - d. Vice-Mayor: Mr. Block said that he and the Mayor recently reached out to Jupiter Medical Center to discuss getting the Covid19 Vaccines for our residents. He said that it is unlikely this will happen for approximately a month or two.

- e. Mayor Comerford- Mayor Comerford gave a Code Enforcement Report; two stop-work orders, eight complaints were addressed, five violations were issued, and \$1323.75 was collected in fees and fines. Mayor Comerford informed residents that a lovely card came in over the holidays from the Beyer family thanking the Town for all of their hard work. The Mayor said the Social Committee did an excellent job with the Holiday Lights Contest; the prizes were nicely divided, allowing everyone to participate. Mayor Comerford also said there will not be a State of the Colony address this year; the Annual Meeting has been canceled.
- 4. Discussion: Monument Wall. Mayor Comerford said that residents were given a choice to vote on; there were a total of 65 votes. #1 Choice had 50 people for the "Times" Font, and #2 Choice had 15 votes for the "Script" Font. The wall has been squared off and prepped by Mike Armato, free of charge. The price is approximately \$6500.00. Commissioner Busto made a motion to accept the plans and to move forward with having the work completed on the Monument Wall. Vice Mayor Block seconded the motion. Motion passed 4-0.
- 5. Discussion: Street Signs and Signage on Walls. Attorney Bill Doney suggested that the Town speak to Mailbox. Com and inquire about piggybacking off another contract to avoid the lengthy process of having to go out for bid. Mayor Comerford said the choices would be put on our website tomorrow, and residents will be able to email their choice to the Chief. He has spoken to several companies and feels the best option is the Combination Street and Stop Signs.
- 6. Discussion: Marine Unit. This item was tabled until next month.
- 7. Wrap-up and Adjourn.
