Blooms last for several weeks in late spring and provide an excellent nectar source for many pollinators.

Golden Alexanders is a larval host for 4 species of butterflies and moths including the Black Swallowtail. This plant is known to be both medicinal and edible and can be used in cut flower arrangements.
