Scott Riley played three years of varsity basketball. As a quick guard, he led the team in assists and steals and helped his team to an IAC Small School Championship. He played one year of golf as a club activity and helped to establish it as a varsity sport.

Scott's had an outstanding four year high school varsity career in his strongest sport – soccer. He ranks among the top twenty Marathon players in all career offensive categories including 20th in goals scored with 31, 4th in assists with 29, and 12th in total points with 91. He was a key factor in helping his teams to two IAC Championships and one Section IV Championship. His most notable single game performance came as he led the team back from a two goal deficit with a goal and an assist and then finished by making the final goal in a shootout for the IAC Championship. The game marked the final meeting with long-time rival Cincinnatus as they left the IAC.

Scott continued his soccer career at Broome Community College where he was selected for an All-Regional Second Team. He also represented the USA on U16 and U19 teams in Gothia Cup play in Gothenburg, Sweden and in international matches against Denmark and Scotland.
