Beloved Partners in Ministry,

We are so excited to be welcoming Rev. Kade Mastra from Indonesia to Ohio this month! Rev. Mastra will be joining us through our synod's Mission to the USA program. We will be picking her up on Friday, October 13, and she will be with us through November 3. There will be many opportunities over the three weeks she is here to hear her speak and get to know her:

Rev. Mastra will be welcomed in worship on Sunday, October 15, which will be followed by a welcome reception in her honor. That afternoon, anyone who wishes is invited to join Pastor Jamie and Rev. Mastra in attending an open house at the Masjid Al-Khair Mosque in Youngstown. Indonesia has the largest population of Muslims in the world and Rev. Mastra is interested in learning about American Muslims. This is a great opportunity for us to learn more about our Muslim American brothers and sisters as well.

On Saturday, October 21, Rev. Mastra will be speaking at the presbytery's DiscipleFest event at the Canfield Presbyterian Church (more information on DiscipleFest is included in this newsletter) and Rev. Mastra will be speaking to the Adult Church School classes at 9:15 and preaching in worship on Sunday, October 22.

At 5:30pm before the Mineral Ridge High School football game on Friday, October 27, Pastor Jamie will be hosting a "Tailgate party" in the backyard of the manse so we can show Rev. Mastra what this crazy American sport called football is all about! We will walk down to the game together after we eat. If you know you will be attending, please let me know so I have enough food (and let me know if you want to bring something!).

Finally, on Sunday, October 29, Rev. Mastra will preach during worship and administer communion with Pastor Jamie. Following the service there will be a Fall Harvest themed potluck.

Throughout her time here, Rev Mastra is scheduled to speak at other places including several classes at the elementary and high schools. There are also still plenty of opportunities for YOU to invite her out to dinner or over to your house. A sign-up sheet is available in the Fellowship Hall or you can contact me or Brooke Kaschak to get on the schedule.

In the meantime, let us pray for Rev. Mastra as she travels to the US, as she prepares herself to speak and preach, and as she acclimates herself to a different culture and climate. Let us also pray for our congregation, that we may be open to everything she has to teach and share with us. May we welcome her with open arms and open hearts!



"Waking Up White and Finding Myself in the Story of Race."


Book Group Is Delving Into the "Racism" Issue

Hello Church Family and Friends,

The Interpretation and Stewardship Committee has begun working with Pastor Jamie to prepare for the upcoming 2018 budget and Fall Stewardship Campaign.
