
They can also be reloaded with additional dollars when all have been spent. They make great gifts for your favorite train enthusiast.





New Meters on the O Layout

You may have noticed recently some more meters have showed up on the back of the new layout. If you didn't know the existing meters (now the top row of meters) show voltage going to different power districts of the layout. Behind the meters it is painted with the same color wire we used for that power district, that also corresponds with the color of the drawers down below where it is also labeled. The top meters show voltage or the potential to do "work" (make trains run) the new meters on the bottom row show amperage or the "strength of the electrical current" (locomotive struggling up a hill). This can do a number of things, allow you to see what your train may draw just sitting which could include passenger car lighting and smoke units. As a train starts to move the amp draw will increase and with cruise control equipped locomotives the amp draw will change as the locomotive pulls the train across level track or when it starts to climb a hill and even when it starts to head downhill. Each of our mainlines and the yard are equipped with two 180W Lionel PowerHouse transformers that feed a 360W LEGACY PowerMaster. This means you have the capability to use up to 360W of power, a Watt(W) is the "actual work done". If you take our nominal voltage of 18V and divide that by the available wattage of 360W that gives each power district the ability to sustain 20A of current, most trains do good to hit 10A with incandescent lighted cars and Pullmore motors with the set up on the layout this makes sure we can run just about any train and if your ambitious enough even two trains on the same track.
