Praise the LORD! Praise the LORD, O my soul! <sup>2</sup> I will praise the LORD as long as I live; I will sing praises to my God all my life long. <sup>3</sup> Do not put your trust in princes, in mortals, in

whom there is no help. <sup>4</sup> When their breath departs, they return to the earth; on that very day their plans perish. <sup>5</sup> Happy are those whose help is the God of Jacob, whose hope is in the LORD their God, <sup>6</sup> who made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them; who keeps faith forever; <sup>7</sup> who executes justice for the oppressed; who gives food to the hungry. The LORD sets the prisoners free; <sup>8</sup> the LORD opens the eyes of the blind. The LORD lifts up those who are bowed down; the LORD loves the righteous. <sup>9</sup> The LORD watches over the strangers; he upholds the orphan and the widow, but the way of the wicked he brings to ruin. <sup>10</sup> The LORD will reign forever, your God, O Zion, for all generations. Praise the LORD!

Psalm 146:1-10

The Lord opens the eyes of the blind. The Lord lifts up those who are bowed down; the Lord loves the righteous.

I believe God's people in every time and place have read this Psalm with a bit of cognitive dissonance. We know ultimately the plans of human beings are insignificant and fleeting in comparison to God's eternal and sovereign will. Yet, we look around us and the plans of human beings seem to affect us at every turn. The Psalmist seems to describe a world, a kingdom, that we do not recognize. Where is this place where justice is done, the hungry are fed, the lowly are lifted up, the orphans and widows are cared for, and the wicked are ruined?

God's people have historically concluded that while the words of the Psalmist are true of God's character, the realization of the Psalm is still in process. The vision we see in this Psalm reveals God's character and gives us a glimpse of God's kingdom. We saw this kingdom breaking into the world in Jesus Christ. We believe the church by the power of the Holy Spirit can give the world a taste of God's kingdom that is yet to fully arrive, but God alone can bring it in its fullness.

In this tension we can be vulnerable and despair. We feel acutely helpless in righting all the wrongs in this world. We can read this Psalm and be struck by how far we are from a world where God's reign is absolute.

We need to remember the foolishness not only of trusting in princes, but also in ourselves. As we ponder our place in God's great plan, I offer to you this reflection from Ken Untener.

It helps, now and then, to step back and take a long view. The kingdom is not only beyond our efforts, it is even beyond our vision. We accomplish in our lifetime only a tiny fraction of the magnificent enterprise that is God's work. Nothing we do is complete, which is a way of saying that the Kingdom always lies beyond us.

No statement says all that could be said. No prayer fully expresses our faith. No confession brings perfection. No pastoral visit brings wholeness. No program accomplishes the Church's mission.

No set of goals and objectives includes everything. This is what we are about.

We plant the seeds that one day will grow.

We water seeds already planted, knowing that they hold future promise. We lay foundations that will need further development.

We provide yeast that produces far beyond our capabilities.

# Mission of the Month

KICY broadcasts from Nome, Alaska and is owned by Arctic Broadcasting Association, which is a 501(c)3 non-profit, affiliated corporation of the Evangelical Covenant Church. KICY serves native Alaskan villages and the Russian far east. Most of our annual operating budget comes from churches and individual donations.

Since we first signed-on in 1960, KICY has continued to broadcast the good news of Jesus Christ throughout Western Alaska and the Russian Far East. We have increased our power to 50,000 watts, 24 hours a day which allows KICY AM 850 the opportunity to send the gospel into some places where other forms of media are not readily available.



The fourth Sunday of October is the 19th Annual KICY 100% Sunday. This is the one day of the year when KICY seeks denomination-wide donations of only \$1.00, but from 100% of those in a Covenant Church on that Sunday morning. This allows everyone throughout the Covenant family to invest in the work of KICY prayerfully and financially. We will be collecting donations for KICY throughout the entire month, and will be participating in 100% Sunday on October 28. Please keep this mission in special prayer throughout the month.



At the quarterly business meeting in June, the church voted to pack our own Christmas shoeboxes this year to be delivered through Grace Christian Outreach Ministries in Mexico instead of participating in Operation Christmas Child as we have done in years past. The "Joy Boxes" will be the mission of the month in November. There are some fun activities planned around this mission, so mark your calendars now for the following activities...



# Wednesday Night Study




The Wednesday night study titled Grace/Truth 1.0, which is led by Pastor Erik will finish up on October 10.

# Dawson Covenant Youth Corner

I have always had a particular affinity for the autumnal season. I love the cool air, leaves changing, and with it embarks new seasons: school, football, and youth group. Mind you, I never grew up attending a youth group that met weekly; we did not have that sort of thing where I was growing up and I realize the missed opportunities I could have had. Our youth group began meeting regularly at the beginning of September and we have had quite a lot of momentum since then. I was at an all youth pastor meeting in the Twin Cities last week and when asked what's something they could be praying for specifically I mentioned more seating!

We have averaged between 30-40 7<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup> graders each week in combining once again with Calvary Baptist of Madison. The first week we went over, "How to begin the school year effectively" and talked about how Jesus combatted Satan's temptations in the wilderness. Since then, we have been in a series I created that dives into popular Christian songs and breaks them down, both theologically and applicably for the kids; the idea for this came to me while at CHIC this summer and seeing thousands of kids worshiping God and it made me think, "do they know the importance of what they are singing?" This past week, as I hope to do with every fourth Wednesday we meet, we had a special guest speaker come in and share their testimony for the kids. This gets our youth to interact with other adults besides me and allows those of the church to do the same with the youth.




Game time at Hi-League can get crazy! This game involved wearing pantyhose over your head and attempting to eat chocolate pudding!

Pioneer Kids has been operating seamlessly as well. As you know, this group is specifically volunteer lead and they do a great job of helping shape the kids into a Biblical foundation. I get the opportunity to lead music and sing with them, but then I take my leave and turn it over to the teachers. We have had consistently 20 or so kids and each week I see one of our kids bringing a friend or two with them, which is encouraging. Our leadership team decided that I be in front of this age group a little more this year, so on those fourth Wednesdays I get to teach the Pioneer Kid's lesson.

Staying with PK's, our third year working with 'Think Orange' curriculum has begun once again. We have discovered that this format works well where the K-6<sup>th</sup> graders are all together for their lesson and then break out for age-specific group time. This allows us to concentrate the application of the Bible story to a specific age group as well.

Our older youth kids finally get to utilize the youth room Sunday mornings! I get the opportunity to dive deeper into scripture with these kids now that they have been confirmed and have a starting knowledge of the Bible. We began last week the Immerse Bible: Messiah which takes out all the chapter and verses of



Thus far, our kids have continued to be invested in committing to giving up a day of the week to come together. We are growing in size, and kids are bringing friends that we may not see otherwise. I have the opportunity to get out into the community a little more as well to socialize and continue building relationships with our youth. Though I get these chances I know there is more I could be doing and just want to open invite anybody to come sit in or assist our youth in any way. Raising these kids to be godly adults is not a 'one-person-job' and it requires us all as a church to come together and pour into them. Thank you for those who have volunteered time, energy, prayers, and love to our youth group. Autumn is now here, and with it comes fresh, crisp air and new beginnings.


