YES <i>Jill reviewed the meeting minutes from January. Minutes were approved as written.</i></p>		
<p>SARC (30 minutes)</p>	<p>Rosanna Herrera, SARC (Support, Advocacy and Resource Center) <i>Rosanna introduced herself and provided some background information about SARC. All services are free and confidential. Initially they were called the Sexual Assault Response Center, and they have changed their name to more accurately reflect the services they provide. SARC provides services to those who are victims of crime, to provide advocacy, and support. SARC has a new building that holds several different programs. SARC not only works with victims of sexual assault, but they work with individuals who are victims of trafficking, counseling program, and a prevention program. Rosanna provided information regarding the population of clients that they serve, as well as some demographics and number of clients they see each year. 77% of victims that are served are under the age of 18. They do have a general crimes program that serves people that have been a victim of a crime such as assault, arson, etc. These are non-familial and non-intimate partner crimes. Those that have been a victim of a familial or intimate partner crimes are referred to the Domestic Violence Services of Benton and Franklin Counties. SARC is a resource center and they are able to more referrals to appropriate services. Since COVID there have been an increase in violent</i></p>		

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	<p><i>crimes in our community. Now able to provide more extensive services to those victims of sex trafficking. Discussed the variations of sex trafficking, including child sexual abuse material. An advocate is located at the juvenile justice center and screens for abuse and assists with providing youth with services. SARC also sees people who have been victims of exploitation. SARC provides supports and informing them of what their rights are and providing information about what reporting is like. SARC provides legal advocacy and information regarding their case. SARC does not provide legal advice but they are familiar with the legal processes. SARC also provides advocates for those who would like support during medical examinations including rape kits. SARC can assist people with accessing money from the Crime Victims Fund, which is through L and I. SARC also has a survivor closet that is given to those victims that are receiving services. Counseling program has been developed for those who do not have insurance or who don't have easy access to counseling services. Counselors are trauma informed and can also provide assistance to those who are going through the process of a trial. There is also a prevention program that has a variety of courses for young to high schools and adults that focuses on raising awareness. Discussed various community events and campaigns in the area. Encouraged people to get involved in SARC and how to contact them for information on volunteering.</i></p>

FYSPRT State Meeting Update (5 minutes)	<p>Family Tri-Lead Jeanette Barnes, System Tri-Lead Jill Mulhausen <i>Jill, Jeanette and Meredith provided an update regarding the State FYSPRT meeting. Transportation concerns were discussed. Youth and Young Adult Continuation of Care Committee presented on various legislative bills that they are promoting and supporting. Jill reviewed the agenda and shared the presentation from the YYACCC presentation.</i></p>
Roundtable Discussion (15 minutes)	<p>All members <i>Meredith – Update that FYSPRT did not attend the Family Expo due to high COVID cases and exposure to COVID. Encouraged members to attend the Say it out Loud Conference</i> <i>Cindy – Ombuds not sure what will happen at the end of the year as they transition from current structure of Ombuds to a completely different system. Ombuds continues to serve consumers as per usual. Encouraged members to read House Bill 1865 regarding peer support services in WA state.</i> <i>Jeanette – Discussed House Bill 1865 and concerns regarding the implications of this bill passing.</i> <i>Carolyn – Introduced Tyus Reed as new assistant executive director, SPARK will be doing some consulting specifically for Transition Age Youth, hiring Mohammad and he is taking JR CPC class, talking with Coyote Ridge and using this program for adults</i> <i>Tyus – Introduced himself and the role he will be playing in SPARK, SPARK classes coming up</i> <i>Maria – SPARK classes going to be coming up, website and additional work with the state, talking with HCA about future project and collaborations</i> <i>Cari – Want to collaborate with the community and meet quarterly about policies, procedures, and there will be doing an open community forum on Friday at 3 Rivers</i></p>
