

Calberry Farms Policies

1. Payment for lessons is due before the lesson begins. Lessons are \$65 for a single lesson, \$230 a month for one lesson a week, or \$300 a month for one lesson a week and one independent ride a week.
2. Lessons canceled with 48 hours notice or less will still be charged the lesson price. It is greatly appreciated if you give one week's notice to cancel.
3. Lessons are held on regular weekly schedules. Please sign up on the lesson board to confirm your next lesson every week.
4. Lessons will be held in a wide range of weather conditions; heat, cold, wind, light rain. Barn lessons may be held in the event of heavier rain where students have the opportunity to learn more about the care of horses. If you are a fair weather rider, please check the weather in advance and reschedule with at least 48 hours notice. Calberry Farms will cancel lessons in the event of dangerous weather with no charge to the rider.
5. Private lessons are 45 minutes. Lessons with multiple riders can range from 60 to 75 minutes. Grooming and tacking up and untacking and caring for the horse after the ride will be included in the lesson time until riders are able to do these things themselves. Parents are welcome (but certainly not required) to join in the grooming, tacking up, and untacking process for beginning riders. Once riders are able to do these things without assistance, they can have the full lesson time in the saddle by arriving early and being ready to ride at the lesson start time as well as staying late to take care of and turn their horse out after the lesson is over.
6. Lessons start and end at their scheduled time. If a rider is late, the lesson will be shorter.
8. As part of good horsemanship and as a sign of respect to other Calberry Farms patrons and to the facility, all riders who are capable of doing so (small children and new beginners are exempt) are expected to clean their bridle, sweep their cross tie, and clean their horse's stall. It is also appreciated if riders learn to get their horse out of the field.
9. Calberry Farms is against thinness culture and fat phobia! But unfortunately the horses cannot carry over 200 lbs. So sorry for any inconvenience!
10. Multiple instructors teach at Calberry Farms. A rider's first lesson will be an assessment to see which instructor would be best for the student. Scheduling is also taken into account when pairing a student with an instructor. A rider may sometimes have a substitute instructor or a change of instructor.
11. Calberry Farms is dog friendly! Please do bring your dog! If you do not want CF dogs near your car, you are welcome to park along the driveway and walk down.
