

NEW BUSINESS

REVIEW CY 2018 BEST PRACTICES INVENTORY SUBMITTED TO DCA ON NOVEMBER 12, 2018

The State of New Jersey created the Annual Best Practices Questionnaire as a methodology of correlating a municipality's performance with the amount of State Aid they receive in a given calendar year. Administrator J. Caruso stated that she completed and submitted Hampton Township's 2018 Best Practices Questionnaire on November 12, 2018. Based on the performance score, the municipality will receive the full of amount of State Aid for CY 2018.

A MOTION was made by Committeeman D. Hansen and seconded by Committeeman T. Dooley, with all members present in favor, to acknowledge the review and submittal of Hampton Township's 2018 Best Practices Worksheet to the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs ON November 12, 2018.

IMPROVEMENTS TO LAKEVIEW DRIVE IN KEMAH LAKE

Township Administrator J. Caruso stated that drainage improvements are scheduled to begin on Lakeview Drive within the next week. She explained that Township DPW Manager D. Bayles expressed concerns about alterations a resident possibly made to a township drainage easement located within the parameters of the drainage project. Mr. D. Bayles intends to inspect the site to determine whether alterations occurred, and if so, what the impact might be moving forward.

NEW JERSEY HERALD VISIONS MAGAZINE

A MOTION was made by Committeeman T. Dooley and seconded by Committeeman D. Hansen, with all members present in favor, to authorize the placement of a quarter-page display ad in an annual community publication of the New Jersey Herald called, *Visions Magazine*.

NEW SOUND SYSTEM FOR THE TOWNSHIP MEETING ROOM

Township Administrator J. Caruso stated that she is in the process of obtaining additional quotes to replace the twenty-two year old Sound System in the Municipal Meeting Room. The first quote included expensive equipment with features that are unnecessary for the township's purposes.

Additionally, DPW Manager D. Bayles received a quote to replace lights in the Municipal Meeting Room with more energy-efficient bulbs at a rate of \$100.00 per bulb. In addition to being more cost effective, the new lighting would also eliminate a constant humming noise emitting from the existing bulbs.

A MOTION was made by Committeeman D. Hansen and seconded by Committeeman T. Dooley, with all members present in favor, to table the above referenced issue until additional quotes have been obtained.

A MOTION was made by Mayor P. Yetter and seconded by Committeeman D. Hansen, with all members present in favor, to schedule the December 2019 Hampton Township Committee Meeting on Monday, December 23, 2019 at 7:00 P.M.

HAMPTON TOWNSHIP FIRE AND RESCUE UPDATE

Committeeman D. Hansen stated that the first weekend of the Annual Hampton Township Fire & Rescue, Inc. Christmas Tree, Wreath, and Grave Blanket Sale was very successful. The sale will continue through the coming weeks until they sell the entire inventory.

Committeeman D. Hansen stated that HTVFR would assist at the Hampton Township Annual Tree Lighting by driving Santa Claus to the Municipal Complex on a Fire Truck. The event will take place on December 7, 2018 at 7:00 P.M.

Committeeman D. Hansen stated that HTVFR Officers plan to attend the 2018 Annual Recognition Dinner.

Township Administrator J. Caruso stated that HTVFR recently accepted delivery of a new Jaws of Life apparatus. HTVFR members will participate in training sessions to become fully proficient on the new equipment.

PUBLIC SESSION

Township resident Mr. J. Calvani stated that his neighbor has been constructing a home for the past several years. He explained that almost every weekend he and his family are subjected to the sound of large machinery. Even though the next-door neighbor complies with Township Code by working during the permitted hours, it has become an intolerable situation due to the lengthy construction process.

Township Committeeman D. Hansen stated that Morris Township has an ordinance limiting the amount of hours a paid contractor can use heavy equipment on Saturdays and are prohibited from working on Sundays. Homeowners are given more latitude on weekends if they are doing the work themselves, but are still limited by certain restrictions.

Committeeman D. Hansen stated that he would provide a copy of the ordinance to township officials for review and consideration.

Mr. Calvani explained that in addition to the loud construction noise next-door, the same neighbor removed a section of an existing rock wall bordering his property, resulting in excess water running in to Mr. Calvani's yard. It is adversely affecting his parcel, as well as surrounding neighbors. In order to divert the water flow, the neighbor trespasses on adjacent properties.

Mr. Calvani stated that he called the Sussex County Soil Conservation District in September because the neighbor in question was suppose to put up a silt fence to catch storm runoff debris, but has not done so. The Soil Conservation has not followed up with Mr. Calvani.

The State approved a catch basin with a 90-degree angle to help correct the runoff issue by redirecting some of the water. Mr. Calvani explained that the 90-degree angle is too sharp to catch the water after heavy rainstorms.

Township Attorney F. McGovern stated that Mr. Calvani could seek relief from the Court by way of a Court Restraint prohibiting the neighbor from trespassing and causing disturbance to the existing natural habitat. Mr. F. McGovern agreed to review the approval resolutions for that

particular Block and Lot to determine whether the homeowner is in compliance. In addition, Committeeman D. Hansen suggested asking Township Engineering Consultant D. Simmons to inspect the site.

Township Administrator J. Caruso stated that she recently contacted Mr. D. Simmons to inspect the site after receiving a call from Mr. Calvani. At that time, Township DPW Manager D. Bayles also asked inspected the site.

Due to the nature of the complaint, the Township Committee agreed by full consensus that the agency with proper jurisdiction over this matter is the Soil Conservation District. Mr. Calvani agreed and requested assistance from the Township Committee to intervene on his behalf by contacting the Soil Conservation District to get a status report.

Township Attorney F. McGovern agreed to contact the Soil Conservation District. He asked Mr. Calvani to provide him with the names of representatives he has spoken with regarding this matter.


