Always Seek the Good in Others

If the virtue of humility is often understood when directly exercised toward God, the same virtue is liable to still greater misconception when exercised toward our neighbor. There are two things to be considered in every man, and these two things have to be well and carefully distinguished from each other: what man is of himself, and what he is by the super-added gifts of God. Every man should subject what is purely his own to what is of God, whether that which is of God is in himself or in another.

This is the principle of humility in its exercise toward our neighbor; it is not a reverence given to human nature, but to the gifts of God within that nature.

Few persons, perhaps, reflect on the beauty of the reward we receive for humility to our neighbor. This humility opens to the soul to all the good that God has planted in other souls.

Those are the happy sunshiny souls that are open to see all the good influences of God around them, and that receive into themselves the reflection of the divine good which God has given to other souls. This is one of the great privileges of a truly religious society where humility and charity are the dominant virtues: each soul is always receiving a beautiful and powerful influence from all the rest of the community.

It is the will of men acting apart from God, and preferring in their pride to see the evil rather than the good in their fellow men, that so bitterly entangles this world of human nature. It is the myriads of self-wills, each impelled by its own self-love, that produce the knots, the travels, and the

interminable complications that make this world such a wearying perplexity to those thoughtful minds devoid of the wisdom that descends from God. The tragedy of human life is not the strife of free will with fate that the ignorant pagans imagine, but the collision of pride with the providence of humiliation; of self-will destined always to defeat, against the will of God.

There is such an enormous distance between what we are by nature and what God would have us be by his grace, so that we may pass from misery to happiness; and the obstacles within us that hold us back or throw us the other way are of such a kind – tending to seek false instead of true greatness, in the exaltation of ourselves, and not in ascending to things greater than ourselves – that this alone shows us what a great part humility must take in replacing us on the path that leads us to God.

Although the light that descends to us from God is the chief principle of self-knowledge, the watching of our conduct toward our neighbors also helps us very much to know ourselves.

Siempre busca lo bueno en los demás

Si la virtud de la humildad a menudo se entiende cuando se ejerce directamente hacia Dios, la misma virtud es susceptible de un error aún mayor cuando se ejerce hacia nuestro prójimo. Hay dos cosas que se deben considerar en cada hombre, y estas dos cosas deben distinguirse bien y cuidadosamente unas de otras: lo que el hombre es de sí mismo y lo que es por los dones súper agregados de Dios. Todo hombre debe someter lo que es puramente suyo a lo que es de Dios, ya sea lo que es de Dios está en sí mismo o en otro.

Este es el principio de humildad en su ejercicio hacia nuestro prójimo; no es una reverencia dada a la naturaleza humana, sino a los dones de Dios dentro de esa naturaleza.

Pocas personas, tal vez, reflexionan sobre la belleza de la recompensa que recibimos por la humildad hacia nuestro prójimo. Esta humildad abre al alma a todo el bien que Dios ha plantado en otras almas.

Esas son las almas felices y brillantes que están abiertas a ver todas las buenas influencias de Dios a su alrededor, y que reciben en sí mismas el reflejo del bien divino que Dios ha dado a otras almas. Este es uno de los grandes privilegios de una sociedad verdaderamente religiosa donde la humildad y la caridad son las virtudes dominantes: cada alma siempre recibe una influencia hermosa y poderosa del resto de la comunidad.

Es la voluntad de los hombres que actúan separados de Dios y prefieren en su orgullo ver el mal en lugar del bien en sus semejantes, lo que enreda tan amargamente este mundo de la naturaleza humana. Son las miríadas de voluntad propia, cada una impulsada por su propio amor propio, lo que produce los nudos, los viajes y las complicaciones interminables que hacen de este mundo una perplejidad tan agotadora para esas mentes reflexivas desprovistas de la sabiduría que descende de Dios. La tragedia de la vida humana no es la lucha del libre albedrío con el destino que imaginan los paganos ignorantes, sino la colisión del orgullo con la providencia de la humillación; de voluntad propia siempre destinada a vencer, contra la voluntad de Dios.

Hay una distancia tan enorme entre lo que somos por naturaleza y lo que Dios quiere que seamos por su gracia, para que podamos pasar de la miseria a la felicidad; y los obstáculos dentro de nosotros que nos detienen o nos arrojan hacia el otro lado son de ese tipo: tienden a buscar la grandeza falsa en lugar de la verdadera, en la exaltación de nosotros mismos y no en ascender a cosas más grandes que nosotros mismos, que esto solo muestra qué gran parte de la humildad debe tomar para reemplazarnos en el camino que nos lleva a Dios.

Aunque la luz que nos llega de Dios es el principio principal del autoconocimiento, la observación de nuestra conducta hacia nuestros vecinos también nos ayuda mucho a conocernos a nosotros mismos.
