 **Sunday Reflection:** Friends, the central theme for our readings this Fourth Sunday of Lent is human blindness and the gift of sight from God, as well as the fact that God does not judge by outward appearance. It is of great importance to think of ourselves even for a moment as blind both practically and metaphorically as to be able to rejoice more fully in the gift of sight from God. In the first reading, taken from the First Book of Samuel we hear about the anointing of David as the second king of Israel after the discredited Saul. In Samuel's judgement, Eliab, the eldest son of Jesse, who was tall and handsome, was thought to be God's choice to be king of Israel. The other seven sons of Jesse also had the dignity and physical characteristics of potentially being good leaders. But neither of these was God's choice, for God wanted the youngest, “the shepherd boy” David. This incidence illustrates how blind we can also be in our judgments and how much we need God's help. It reminds us that those whom God involves in his saving plans are not necessarily those whom the world perceives as great. In the Gospel, Jesus sees a future disciple in the blind beggar, and passes over the self-righteous Pharisees who, externally, seemed to be so devoutly religious. The man born blind in this gospel passage, represents all of us who are naturally born blind unable to see God and the world clearly, and therefore in great need of God's gift of sight. What this gospel teaches us is that even though physical sight is a wonderful gift, what we see with our mind and heart (spiritual sight) is even of greater value. Like the Pharisees and scribes, we can hardly see with our spiritual sight because it is often clouded by our self-centeredness, greed, anger, hatred, prejudice, jealousy, addiction to evil habits, hardness of heart, and the like. The good news for us today is that Jesus desires to heal our spiritual blindness. All we need to do is to approach him in all humility, ask him to remove from us the root cause of our blindness. We can pray with William Barclay, the Scottish Bible scholar; “*God our Father, help us see Christ more clearly, love him more dearly and follow him more nearly*” day by day.

It's sincere when we tell all of our sins honestly and truthfully, without exaggerating or excusing them. It's complete when we confess all of our mortal sins, including the number of times we have committed each one.
