Greetings,

Thank you to our executive branch, all our Baltimore County NAACP members who contributed and donators who contributed to our ACT-SO youth attending the National NAACP Convention. We won 3 medals at the National NAACP ACT-SO competition for writing, dance, and art. We also had one of our youth receive \$10,000 to contribute to college. Thank you to all who went to support our youth at the convention.



At the NAACP, we worked on various resolutions relating to "Search and Bark vs Search and Bite", "Funding Disparities for Public and Private HBCU's", the "Need for Gun Control", "Public Defender Caseloads and Ineffective Assistance", and Disproportionate "Disciplining of Black Police Officers".

We also worked on resolutions for "Honesty, Freedom to Learn and Anti-Racism in Education", "Debt- Free College", "Addressing Food Insecurity", "Eliminating the Minority Shortage of Medical Workers", "Expanding the Treatment of Sickle Cell", "Women's Rights to Reproductive Freedom and Health", and "Racial Disparities in Involuntary Commitment and Hospitalization of Children." Each resolution were presented and each delegate voted.

We met with the new Police Chief, McCullough to provide our concerns, such as increasing minority promotion and fair treatment of minority officers, adequate training for police officers, recruitment and retention concerns relating stats, youth car thefts, and continued community engagement. We look forward to working with Chief McCullough to reduce our community concerns.

The Gun Buy Back was a success. We had over 200 people who attended. We collected over 600 guns and varies gun supplies. Thank you to the County Executive Johnny Olszewski for supporting this mission and local churches. We look forward to seeing each of you at our Freedom Fund Ceremony and W.I.N Health and Wellness Fair in October 2023. The Maryland State Conference is Oct. 27 to 28 at the College of Southern Maryland. Feel free to attend all our events.

About 178 evening gowns were donated. The ladies had two weeks to browse through the selection of dresses. Dresses that were left over after that period; half remained at the high school and the other half was donated to a local foster care agency. The Prom Dress Giveaway was so successful that it was deemed to have this as a yearly event at Mervo High School.

COMMUNITY NEWS

On June 16th, BCPS, through the Department of Communications and Community Outreach organized a meeting between NAACP Baltimore County and Comite Latino. This meeting aims to build relationships and work on tasks that benefit both groups. This conversation resulted from the wish of the NAACP of Baltimore County to include other minority groups in their efforts for outreach and education. During the meeting, the Comite Latino members express their gratitude for the conversation and the need to be guided by the NAACP in their advocacy growth since, as they said "you have paved the road for new groups like ours." Both groups share their concerns about the needs in Baltimore County in the healthcare area and voter registration campaigns. These initiatives will be fostered through future collaborations.





On June 1st, Parkville High School held an official ceremony to commemorate the inception of the first NAACP High School Branch in Baltimore County. Nichelle D. Hicks, an English teacher at Parkville High School founded the branch with assistance from the NAACP Baltimore County Branch. There are 25 students representing the founding members of the branch. The students have established various subcommittees for their chapter, including ones focused on political action, youth employment and juvenile justice. The President is Kayla Tabernero and Vice-President is Ja'Kiya Allen. Ms. Hicks has established a presence at the Board of Education meetings by bringing the student leadership from the branch. We would like to thank Raymond English and Ms. Hicks for their amazing efforts in establishing a branch in Parkville High School.

NAACP NATIONAL CONVENTION

The 114th NAACP National Convention was held from July 26th - August 1st at the Boston Convention and Exhibition Center in Boston. The NAACP National Convention is an empowering and immersive experience held each year to celebrate our community's collective power. The Convention attracts innovative change-makers, thought-leaders, entrepreneurs, entertainers, influencers, and creatives to network and exchange ideas.


The theme was "Thriving Together." The attendees gathered together in workshops, plenary sessions, and panel discussions that included voter suppression, student debt, affirmative action, police brutality and reproductive rights.

The Convention also included a virtual career fair, the Women in NAACP Luncheon (WIN), the Springarn Awards Dinner and the Black MET Gala. The WIN Luncheon speaker was the President of the National Council for Negro Women, Reverend Shavon Arline-Bradley.

The NAACP's highest honor, the Springarn Medal was awarded to Dr. Hazel N. Dukes and presented by her friend, former Secretary of State Hillary Clinton. Secretary Clinton commended Dr. Dukes for her many decades of service to the people of New York and dedication to bettering the lives of Black Americans across the country. Dr. Dukes is the President of the NAACP New York State Conference, NAACP National Board of Directors member, NAACP Executive Committee member and a former National President of the NAACP.

The National Convention had over 100 prominent speakers from the political, private and entertainment industries. Vice President Kamala Harris delivered the keynote address this year. She discussed the importance of voting rights, reproductive rights and gun safety laws.



Rep. Ayanna Pressley from the 7th district in Massachusetts delivered an empowering speech on embracing our Black Joy and our Black Brilliance. She also provided highlights on Boston's civil rights history such as being the first chartered branch of the NAACP and citizens that fought for justice and voting rights.



Rapper Meek Mills was a speaker in a panel discussion titled "Hate Has No Home: Racism, Anti-Semitism and Building Bridges to Fight All Hate."

We gathered collectively to foster our intergeneration approach to advocacy. Main stage discussions, luncheons, and the experience hall connected activists, allies, and entrepreneurs from varying backgrounds who are all committed to the same thing: thriving together. We will reconvene again next year in Las Vegas for our 115th National Convention. We'll see you in Vegas!

Women's Empowerment Brunch









We are a team taking a Unified Stance for Statewide Change!


