Nominations for Officers will be taken at our May meeting with *voting for candidates at our June meeting*.


Installation takes place at our July Summer Social.

The majority are by Fenton. She has a dark cobalt blue one that she bought from Jack Peacock. She went to the Fenton Factory and bought 3 baskets (red, yellow, black.)

The Imperial Candlewick one is for her daughter's collection.

She has 2 Westmoreland Hobnail baskets. There are two Sandwich baskets, one in yellow by Indiana and one clear by Duncan Miller.
