A Man Who Understood Freedom

Who comes to mind when you think about the Declaration of Independence? Is it John Hancock? His was the first and the largest of the fifty-six signatures to adorn this patriotic document. Hancock, the President of the Continental Congress and delegate from Massachusetts, according to some accounts, said immediately after signing the Declaration, "There, I guess King George will be able to read that!"

Perhaps it is Benjamin Franklin. He was the oldest man to sign the parchment, and one of the most well-known patriots of the Revolutionary period.

If you really know your history, perhaps you are thinking of the name Charles Carroll. He is the lone signatory who included his hometown, "Charles Carroll of Carrollton." This was to distinguish himself from his father, Charles Carroll of Annapolis, and his cousin Charles Carroll, the Barrister (and later, his son, Charles Carroll of Homewood). When Charles Carroll of Carrollton died in 1832 at the age of ninetyfive, the nation lost the last surviving signer.

All the signers likely understood that their names would be seen by England's rulers as a treasonable act, punishable by death. But there is one man who seems to have really understood this idea of freedom. His name was William Whipple.

William Whipple's name does not hold a prominent place in American history, but that is a shame. He was a representative of New Hampshire and a member of the Continental Congress from 1776 through 1779. He worked as both a ship's captain and a merchant, and he studied in college to become a judge. What did Whipple do that makes him stand out? He had a beloved slave named Prince. And he set Prince free, because he believed that no man could fight for freedom and hold another in bondage.

We, as Christians, have been set free in Christ. In Him is grace. In Him is forgiveness. In Him alone is salvation, as Peter said, "Nor is there salvation in any other, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved" (Acts 4:12). Without Christ there is no grace. No forgiveness. No salvation. No hope.
