

The Lutheran Confessions

Do Lutherans follow the teachings of Martin Luther?

Sorry, but the answer is both "yes" and "no." Lutheran clergy and congregations do not consider everything that Luther ever wrote or said to be authoritative. They are obligated to subscribe only to those of his writings which appear in the Confessional Books of the Evangelical Lutheran Church.

To call the Lutheran Church a "confessional Church" does not mean (as many undoubtedly suppose) that we are a Church in which congregations use the Brief Order for Confession and Forgiveness every Sunday morning. Rather, the term "confessional Church" means that we are a Church which has a number of writings which set forth and describe with authority certain beliefs and some standard practices for the life of the church. A "confession" is a statement of faith or belief.

The Confessional documents of the Lutheran Church are contained in a single volume called *The Book of Concord* (June 25, 1580). These documents were, and are, intended to be used as a summary of our doctrine, a basis for unity, as safeguards against heresy or errors, and the basis for teaching and instruction.

The Confessional documents of the Evangelical Lutheran Church are

The Three Chief Symbols (Apostles', Nicene, and Athanasian Creeds)

The Augsburg Confession (written by Philip Melanchthon, 1530)

The Apology to the Augsburg Confession (Melanchthon, 1531)

The Smalcald Articles (Martin Luther, 1537)

The Treatise on the Power and Power and Primacy of the Pope (Luther, 1537)

The Small Catechism (Luther, 1529)

The Large Catechism (Luther, 1529)

The Formula of Concord (1577)

Although Martin Luther wrote a great deal, Lutherans accept only his Large and Small Catechism and his Smalcald Articles as authoritative interpretations of the Scriptures. Our Faith and our Confessions are not based on Luther but on Christ!

To be a "confessional Church" means that we do not follow the teachings or interpretations of a single person, even if that person is Martin Luther or Philip Melanchthon. To be a "confessional Church" means that our faith is grounded on Christ alone and that we seek to live out and explain our faith within the doctrines and traditions of the catholic Church, of which we are a apart.

Promises at Baptism

Baptism is a covenant relationship between you and God, wherein your child is claimed as one of God's children and given the gift of the Holy Spirit. In response to the promises God makes, parents make several promises. Many parents leave the keeping of those promises to the Christian education, confirmation, and youth programs of their congregation. Unfortunately, if these programs work in isolation and without the support of a

faith nurturing environment in the home, they lose a great deal of their potential effectiveness. How many hours a week is your family in church? At home? A child's faith grows as he or she experiences the faith attitudes and practices of his or her parents and caregivers.

If you can't remember what it is you promised to do for and with your child, talk to your pastor or look up the baptismal service in your worship book. Write a list of the promises you made and put it where you'll see it often. When your child begins elementary school, share the list with him or her. Ask him or her to help you keep the promises you made.




THE ALTAR GUILD is seeking members!

Money Matters

Personal Financial Stewardship

The Perils of Loving Money

"People who want to get rich fall into temptation and a trap and into many foolish and harmful desires that plunge men into ruin and destruction. For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil. Some people, eager for money, have wandered from the faith and pierced themselves with many griefs" 1 Timothy 6:9-10.

How much we love money is not dependent upon the amount of money that we may have. We can love money and have very little love of it, or we can have lots of it and not love it at all. Loving money is very subtle, and it can manifest itself in different ways. For example for those who have accumulated some money, it could be seen in an unhealthy obsession with the investment markets.



It could be seen in our desire to hoard our money and not give. Power and success for those who focus on money is relative to how much money they have.

Because we live in a very materialistic society, there is a great deal of interest in money. Webster's Dictionary defines materialism as "the tendency to be more concerned with material things than with spiritual goals or values." Materialism leads us to spend money we don't have in order to buy things we don't need so that we can impress people we don't even like. A materialistic person loves his possessions, is greedy, and lacks contentment.

The following are three negative consequences of both loving money and becoming part of our materialistic society:

- Distorts our thinking: Our hearts become darkened. "For although they knew God, they neither glorified him as God nor gave thanks to him, but their thinking become futile and their foolish hearts were darkened" (Romans 1:22-23).
- \$\footnote{T}\$ Stimulates our pride: We become self-sufficient rather than relying on God. "You may say to yourself, 'My power and the strength of my hands have produced this wealth for me' "(Deuteronomy 8:17).
- Preoccupies our thoughts: We have no time or concern for the needy or for God. "Their destiny is destruction, their god is their stomach, and their glory is in their shame. Their mind is on earthly things" (Philippians 3:19).

When we call upon God's strength, God will empower us to serve him rather than our money. As we spend time hearing and reading God's Word, he will strengthen our faith so we can break the power that money and possessions can have over us.





The Never-Ending Celebration

Have you ever had so much fun doing something that you wished the day would never end? Maybe you had a wonderful birthday celebration, or you had fun singing songs around a toasty campfire. Wouldn't it be great if times like these could last longer? Celebrations can last a long time, and that's exactly what happens at Easter. Easter is so important that it lasts longer than one day. In fact, it lasts fifty days! There are seven Sundays in those fifty days. If you look around your church during the seven Sundays of Easter you will see and hear things that tell you the celebration is still happening.

Easter music is different from Lenten music. We sing loud, joyful songs about Jesus' resurrection. You may see lots of flowers. If your church has a big candle near the baptismal font—the place where people are baptized—that candle is lighted. In fact, candles are always lighted at special times. The big candle by the font is called the paschal candle, and it's different from all the candles in church. It's lighted during the Easter season and for baptisms and funerals. When this candle is lighted it is a reminder that nothing can stop Jesus' love for us—not even death! In church the Easter celebration lasts all the way until Pentecost, the day the Holy Spirit visited Jesus' friends. But a little bit of Easter is always with us, every day of our lives. That's how important Easter is!
