On the day I started to write this article, the weather was cloudy and it was in the middle of the Holy Week leading up to Easter. So each time I feel there is something to be stated, I jot it down and then continue with a message.

Berks County Pomona Grange is quite different than our Subordinate/Community Granges in the county in various ways. BCPG does not have a permanent facility. This does bring on some complications when it comes to securing liability insurance. Currently Steve Mohn is working on this aspect for the BCPG. I appreciate his knowledge and willingness to secure our organization the insurance coverage we need.

A current project which I feel should be completed to have a better knowledge of where our Pomona stands in its financial area. When the Executive Committee, Treasurer and I met to see where we stand with our financial situation, it was brought forth to complete a budget. Currently this process is taking place and, hopefully, a budget can be presented in the future so we all know where we stand financially. By utilizing a budget, it provides exactly where our finances and expenditures stand. I feel this is a great way to keep restraints on expenditures if we do not have the sources to spend; just like you do with your household income and expenditures.

In the next couple months, we will be doing some fundraisers. These fundraisers will need support from our membership in areas of helping at the Berks County and Oley fairs working in their food stands. Last year we gained funds from the Berks County Fair of \$1,000 and the Oley Fair gave us \$1,300 for our assistance. I look forward to our membership helping to make these two events a success. A

Tip: For the Summer Months:

Earwig Traps: To get rid of earwigs or pincher bugs, place vegetable oil or and cheap food grade oil into a tuna can. The tuna smell attracts the bugs, the can is low enough so they get in easily, and the oil drowns them. This is an easy, low cost way of ridding your home or garden of earwigs without using pesticides.

Keep cut flowers fresh longer by adding a teaspoon of baking soda to your vase's water.

Use baking soda to lessen pain from bee stings.

Mix ½ cup Apple Cider Vinegar to 4 cups water and spray on weeds to help fix up your garden,

AGRICULTURE REPORT by Doug Sattazahn

As spring finally arrives and field work picks up, I think it as good a time as any to remember farm safety. I recently heard of an incident in the Midwest where a child was backed over by a tractor. The driver, the boy's father, thought he was in the yard. He assumed he knew where the child was and that was a big mistake. I once heard a farmer say that he doesn't start any machinery until he knows exactly where his kids ARE, not where they AREN'T. This is good advice for anyone to remember when you are dealing with children and/or animals that are not easily seen.

Personally, I have noticed that when I rush, I make mistakes. Trying to save a little time suddenly becomes very foolish when someone gets hurt, so just slow down. This is also important when passing farm machinery on public roads. Tractors and implements are often wider than a single travel lane. Don't pass a tractor

when it could be possibly turning left into a field or lane. It can be very difficult for the farmer to see what's behind them. Thanks and be safe.

Cooking & kitchen tips:

Bacon strips won't stick together if you roll up the package like a jelly roll before opening it.

To check the freshness of fish, place it in cold water – if it floats it has recently been caught.

Avoid excessive spatters from broiling meat by placing bread slices in the bottom part of the broiler pan to absorb melted fat.

Apply a thin coat of cooking oil around the top of the inside of pots to avoid boil-overs.

To keep a bowl steady while you mix or whip ingredients, place it on a dampened cloth.

Dishwash soap film: Run a cup of white vinegar through the entire dishwasher cycle in an empty dishwasher to remove all soap film.
