Dear Friends,

I hope your summer has been restful and refreshing. Being away is always useful in that it reminds us of what we miss and what we value in the "regular year" of our lives. So, as the summer winds down, I look forward to our reunion as a community. Of course, our calendar does not really allow us to enter the "year" gently. We do not glide in. Instead the Jewish year begins on a crescendo and then moves on from there. 





#### CALLING ALL SHIR CHADASH STUDENTS & PARENTS

Another exciting year is planned for the 2017-2018 school year. As we go into the second year of our new multi-year school curriculum, Tikkun Olam, Tzedakah, and G'milut Chasadim, giving and doing to help our world, will be threaded throughout as it was last year.

However, this year's major themes will be immigration of Jews to the USA, Bible stories, and how our understanding of G-d & prayer help us to lead good, happy lives. Again we will be including parents as an integral part of our program, starting with all children and parents meeting together from 9-9:15 a.m. on September 9<sup>th</sup> for an introduction to the new school year.

#### HELP WANTED TO REVIVE THE MORSE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL LIBRARY

**DID YOU KNOW....** that three years ago, the City of Poughkeepsie eliminated all the librarians in the elementary schools? This means that the nearly 600 kids, grades 1 – 5 at the Morse School, one of the poorest in the district, have had no access to a library, have not been taught how to use a library and haven't been able to take books home to read. Shir Chadash, as a founding member of the Jewish Social Action Coalition, is working with teachers and retired and former City of Poughkeepsie librarians, volunteers from the community and volunteers from our 4 local congregations to revive the Morse School library. This is a huge undertaking that will start modestly, 2 mornings a week, and allow kids, who are only in the school for 5 vital years, to experience a library. Volunteering for this project will warm your heart and provide an incredibly meaningful way to make a real change in the lives of young kids.
