Sheryl Sutherland - joined Staying Put September 2022



Anywhere Sheryl goes .. her energetic, effervescent flair follows ... combined with warmth, generosity and a perpetual broad smile.

She grew up in Pepin, WI., earned an early education degree in Eau Claire, married, and with her husband (an Air Force member), raised her 2 children along the way. “ In those years we moved to MI, CA, OK and back “ .

She now also has 5 grandkids, 4 horses, a puppy and several barn kitties. She has lived in Spring Valley the past 16 years.

Sheryl’s vocational life included that of being a CNA at local nursing homes, and many years of in-home daycare (several places). She comments, “Everywhere I opened my door to daycare, my house was soon full of laughter and fun ... I had 24 kids at one point”. For 20 years she worked as an HMS program server/host at the Mpls. airport. For 3 years she was a para-professional for the SV Schools (the elementary school & Cardinal kids). To this day she still holds fun-filled themed activities for kids at her home (Halloween and other times). As a hobby, Sheryl writes poetry and is a ‘published’ poet. She also makes and sells her own jewelry --- which will be displayed at 2023 Dam Days (she will be helping organize the vendors for the event).

Her first inkling of *Staying Put* was upon seeing fliers and brochures at the Spring Valley Drug store, but was not in a position at that time to pursue volunteer work. The catalyst to renewing her volunteer spirit was after the loss of both her parents. As their caregiver, it occurred to her the need for a bridge from medical care to non-medical services like friendship, delivery of meals, caregiver breaks, errands, etc. As a caregiver to her parents, Sheryl compared the distinct value of a coordinator she had access to while caring for her parents, to the role she would come to see that *Staying Put* plays in filling that empty gap. Her term was “matching book ends”.

Young volunteer – volunteering sensibility and skill developed for Sheryl at an early age. As a youngster she would ride her bike to the local nursing homes – which she recalls being 3 big multi-level houses – to play games, visit, and befriend the residents.

Full Circle – Wanting again to volunteer, she walked into *Staying Put*’s office last September. Having forgotten about seeing the brochures years earlier, she made an instant connection upon seeing the literature, and came on board that day!

Sheryl comments she has really enjoyed getting to know the community through her work with *Staying Put*. While working outside of town all those years, she hadn’t been part of her community, but now feels that connection to the people, the history, and the members of *Staying Put*.

In less than a year with *Staying Put*, Sheryl has volunteered (several times a week) in meal delivery, library book delivery, transportation, friendly visits, caregiver relief, and is a ‘staple’ member of the popular daily coffee-klatch, contributing home-made treats. She recently joined the *SER group – allowing for longer hours and broader service parameters (regular house-assistance, office cleaning & organization, longer care-giver breaks). Sheryl has woven her thread of compassionate service to others into the fabric of *Staying Put*. We are very grateful for her contribution and her joyful presence.
