Hope UCC's Blessing Box Ministry

Last winter, our Mission and Outreach Ministry began the work to create and plan a way to assist our neighbors and address food insecurity issues facing our community. As the Blessing Box ministry began to take shape, plans and dreams became a reality. What was sketched out on paper is now sitting on a table in our Fellowship Hall, currently being painted by our Youth Group. It is a beautiful thing to consider that DURING A

PANDEMIC this Blessing Box special project was initiated, discussed in collaboration with Mission and Outreach, Trustees, the congregation, and Church Council, adapted, developed, constructed, and painted. It will be installed when we begin our new program year in September. It is a testimony to what we learned during the Covid shutdown: although we were not meeting in person at church, church was never closed. We are the church, wherever and however we are gathered. God's activity in our lives does not cease. We live into our mission as Hope UCC in so many ways, and our Blessing Box continues this truth.

As Mission and Outreach begins to plan for the installation we have created a list of essential items we will collect during August and September in order to stock the Blessing Box. Creamy Peanut Butter: 28 oz size jar or smaller


