# Portola/ Alpine Neighborhood Emergency Plan

Note: this plan is designed with a major disaster (i.e. earthquake), but can serve as a framework for other emergency situations.

## Things To Do Before a Disaster Strikes

## To prepare for an emergency

- Develop an evacuation plan for you and your family (don't forget to include animals). Practice the plan.
- Pack and maintain an evacuation go bag, with cloths, personal items, and copies of important documents.
- Have a first aid kit, fire extinguisher readily accessible—remember in a major disaster we are on our own.
- Install automatic gas shutoff valves and maintain defensible space
- Make sure your GMRS radios are charged and that they are programed with the neighborhood communications plan

#### **During and Immediately After an Emergency**

## Ensure the safety of you and your family first!

- If you and/or your family are injured provide first aid and get help if needed
- Take stock of the structural integrity of your house—is it safe to be inside? if you are unsure, move everyone outside—be safe.
- Know where the gas shutoff valve is and how to use it—turn it off after a major earthquake.
- Once you are safe check in with you neighbors, via phone, GMRS radio etc.

### Communicate your status

- For emergencies call 911
- If calling 911 is not possible, try using your GMRS radio on: 462.575MHz on the Baofeng (channel 16 on some radios)

Or

The Long Ridge Repeater 462.600MHz (+5Mhz offset) DCS tone +031N

- A neighborhood check-in will be conducted on the above frequencies, as always emergency messages have priority.
- If you need to get a message out of the neighborhood, try contacting one of the Ham radio operators that live in our neighborhood via GMRS radio.

intersection of Alpine and Portola State Park Roads. This will be the staging area for ARES/CERT
teams and other resources during a major incident, and the alternate site for local radio
communications
