## **Program: Iridescent Glass**

Iridescent glass has a rainbow-like effect on the surface, like soapy bubble or oil or water. Carnival glass gets its iridescent sheen from the application of metallic salts while the glass is still hot. A final firing of the glass brings out the iridescent properties. Fenton began making iridized glass in 1908. Later others began making it on colored glass and it was given away at Carnivals. Hence the "Carnival" nickname. Interest fell off in the late 20s and was picked up again in the 40-50s. Other companies included Fostoria, US Glass, Federal Glass, Jeanette Glass, and WV Glass. Carnival Glass found in crystal and colored glass.

Carole Martinez brought glasses she received as a wedding present in 1982 from her sister and brother-in-law: Fostoria Glass Co., Iridescent "Mother of Pearl" (1920-27), pattern 877.

Bonnie Theard and Carol LeBell brought pieces of FloraGold (1948-50) by Jeanette Glass from their collections including: pitcher with 6 glasses (different sizes), square butter dish, stick butter dish, dinner plate, cup/saucer, cream/sugar, salt/pepper, berry bowl, bonbon.

Keely Stockman brought quite a few pieces: Carnival Imperial Grape ruffled bowl from the 1900s, Northwood bowl; plus iridescent cups & saucers, Madrid Console with Candle Sticks, Normandie grill plate and oval bowl, Beverage Set in Honeycomb by Jeanette, Iris & Herringbone vase, WV Glass goblet with clear base. She talked about the manufacturers and their patterns in iridescent glass: US Glass - Cherry Berry, Federal Glass - Normandie and Madrid, Jeanette Glass - Iris & Herringbone and Anniversary.
