**NYSCC**: Spring Legislative Meeting at Herkimer College. The meeting starts at 9:00 am. There were a Fish and Wildlife Management Board meeting in March. The attendance was higher than usual, and the message was exceptionally well received.

**Old Business:** A local community group wants to put a trail through Reynolds Game Farm where we get our pheasants for the Junior Pheasant Hunt. Cornell is threatening to withdraw it's funding for community project unless it follows the rail bed the bisects the farm diagonally. The Federation will never support putting a trail through Reynolds Game Farm.

**New Business:** An incident involving the D.E.C where two federation members on club property were shooting unknowingly 350 ft. from an adjoining home. The D.E.C was notified. Federation officials spoke with the complainant and ensured the incident will never happen again. The owner agreed to drop the complaint. The gun club measured and marked the distance of 500 ft to ensure the incident does not repeat itself. It is recommended that all clubs measure their property lines as well as videotape their property.
