The workshop really kept the Trail Duster Express racing round the bend in the track, but you can read more about that in the Coordinator's Column. A tip of the hat to Arlen for leading and to Caren & Sherwin for volunteering their home.

Let's not forget the angels!. You angels have been the fuel that keeps the Express speeding along. We truly appreciate your helping the Rail Dusters in class and showing up so regularly. Your support has been a big part of the Rail Dusters' progress towards graduation.

Next stop is the May weekend. A gaggle of Trail Dusters and Rail Dusters have signed up for this fun event and a good time for all is certain. Don't forget to get back on the Trail Duster Express as it heads home to Bay Laurel and graduation.
