

Looking Back FIRST BABY BORN IN LIONS BAY

Sharon and Alex Dalrymple bought their first lot in Lions Bay in 1959. The young couple camped that summer on their piece of land. Relatives and friends voiced their concern. Sleeping in a tent was not enough protection against the wildlife in Lions Bay. The warnings did not stop the young pioneers. They knew that the move to the country might even mean encounters with bears.

In 1960 they started to build their home on Seaview. During this time they lived in Gordon and Robin Kern's house on Seaview Place. The young couple expected their first child in 1961. Sharon gave birth to a healthy and beautiful baby girl Chrisandra Mary Dalrymple (Chrisan) was born on Sunday, October 22, 1961 at 6.33 p.m. She was born at St. Vincent's Hospital in Vancouver. She weighed 7 lbs. 11 ozs. Chrisan has two siblings, a sister, Janice Loree Dalrymple (Spencer) born December 5, 1963 and a brother Benjamin Knox Dalrymple born June 20, 1965.

Chrisan had great times growing up in beautiful Lions Bay and spent hours playing outdoors at home and at the beach-park.
