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"Wait On It"

My prayer and blessing for you is that vou will discover and uncover the mysteries of God in His ways and His word. I pray for you a revelation of His grace in your life and that all lessons *imparted to* you through *your message* will become revelatory teaching for the flock of God.



First of all I want to give glory to God for I am cancer free! On May 8th, 2014 I had surgery for two skin cancers. The dermatologists I had been to for years and who had treated two other skin cancers, overlooked a black mole I had on my neck and did not trust my judgment on another spot that was suspicious. It took my persistence and seeing another doctor to get them both biopsied. I found myself in a battle with the healthcare system, to get someone to listen and to care. The results came back; melanoma and basal cell can-

cer were the diagnoses. The diagnosis of melanoma particularly shook me because my Mother died of melanoma at the age of 33. But God said "I've got that!"

After two plastic surgeon referrals I found the surgeon God desired to do my surgery. The surgery is called MOHS and I had been through it before. MOHS removes the cancer while saving the healthy skin as much as possible. It's a long and arduous procedure as the skin is excised and then you wait for the lab results to see if the marginal lines they removed were clear of cancer.

I went into this surgery expecting what I had experienced before and minimal scarring. What happened was unexpected. I was horrified at the end of the day when the nurse showed me a picture of my incisions. I went into emotional shock. I thought it would be a small incision because the spots were so small. However, the cancer had spread and the spots had to be excised until the cancer was gone. They had to go in three times to get it all. Therefore, a good deal of flesh was removed. I was grateful the cancer was gone but my heart was stunned at what I had seen and not expected.

I left in pain, physically and emotionally. I got in my car to begin my journey home, which was an hour and a half away, and all I could do was cry. I was wounded. I was disappointed. Then suddenly and ever so softly I heard the Lord whisper to me: "Wait on it". He is so loving to prepare us even for the pain. His words brought a sense of peace and assurance way down deep. Here's why:

You see a week earlier I was sitting in my garden and I looked up at my Mountain Laurel bush. It was in full bloom. I began to hear the Lord speak to me and He gave me this message to post to Facebook: "Wait on it! What you see now is not what it looked like before. (See pictures) In fact when I first moved into my house I did not know what this shrub was. I thought it was ugly and contemplated cutting it down. But I sensed to wait. I learned that it was a mountain laurel. Very few in this area left. My first Spring here and this is the result of my waiting. Sometimes that's how it is in our lives. It looks ugly and barren. But if you will just wait on it, on the One who is faithful, beauty will come forth. Your mess will be your message. Don't move too fast or in haste to get rid of or out of what He has called you to or given to you. Spring will come and in your enduring you will be blessed."

In the weeks that followed I took time to heal and spend time with Him. I cannot reveal all that I have learned or revelations I have gleaned. You see I am still in process. But, I will tell you this. I am grateful for the scars for they are a sign of healing and preservation of life; my life is valuable to Him; my beauty goes beyond my appearance; He works miracles through the skilled hands of surgeons; my scars can bring healing to others; and finally, I'm learning even more not to despise the scars but to embrace them. I have many scars on my body from many surgeries and many injuries. In fact I can be identified by my scars and they tell my story.

My scars do not compare to His, but are evidence of His healing in my life.

evil stay and be a squatter in God's country? Or shall we fight?


We can call on the Kingdom and bring it in. A message from Kristin Wright- Open Doors USA Director of Advocacy

After Sudan faced unprecedented international pressure on her case, Meriam's death sentence for apostasy was cancelled by a court in Khartoum, and all charges against her were dropped.

But when she and her family attempted to leave Sudan on Tuesday, June 24, 2014, they were arrested again, detained, and eventually released. Currently taking temporary shelter in the U.S. Embassy in Khartoum, Meriam and her family are still waiting – and hoping – to be able to come to the United States.

Facing death threats from her own family, Meriam's life is at risk the longer she stays in Sudan. It is crucial that she be granted safe and swift passage to the United States. You can take action for this courageous Christian woman, and continue to be a voice on her behalf.

The Declaration of Independence was the birth certificate for this nation, but the men who signed it knew it could be their death warrant. The closing paragraph states, "And for the support of this Declaration, with a firm reliance of the protection of Divine Providence, we mutually pledge to each other our lives, our fortunes, and our sacred honor." The 56 Founding Fathers, 27 of whom were trained as ministers, took their pledge seriously. On the morning of the signing, there was silence and gloom as each man was called up to the table of the President of Congress to sign the document, knowing that it could mean their death by hanging. Most wars have a motto. The motto of World War II was "Remember Pearl Harbor." The motto during the Texas war for independence was "Remember the Alamo." The spiritual emphasis, directed towards King George III who violated God's laws, gave rise to a motto during the American Revolution: "No King but King Jesus." The Founding Fathers passed the torch to us. It is our responsibility to not let it go out.

Connie Adams, originally from Greensboro, lives at the North Carolina State Veterans Home just next door to the Salisbury National Cemetery. He got his son-in-law, Frank Bennett, to bring him over for the "You Are Not Forgotten" Ceremony on Saturday morning. The cremated and unclaimed remains of 15 veterans were interred with full military rites during the service. Adams completed three active tours in Vietnam, and knew the importance of the service. Though no one had claimed these remains, he didn't want them to be buried alone and neither did about 300 others who attended the service. Adams said, "It is important to be here." That simple statement summed up the thoughts of many on the beautiful Saturday morning.

At a little before 11 a.m., the remains of 15 veterans, many of whom had served in World War II, Korea, and Vietnam, were unloaded from a hearse, catalogued and respectfully placed in the shelter at the cemetery. An American flag accompanied each veteran as current and former members of service carried the urns. A gentle breeze caused numerous additional flags to flutter in the breeze as a short but moving service began.

John McColley, a North Carolina Missing in America Project volunteer, welcomed everyone. Sherry Yetter, sang the National Anthem. Following the Pledge of Allegiance, Chaplain and MIAP volunteer Reverend W.D. Sirginson gave the invocation. He asked that all in attendance remember that their freedom was purchased by these veterans that we are now assembled to honor.

Donald Owens, Salisbury National Cemetery Director, told everyone that 2200 veterans were interred at this cemetery and that now 15 humble men and women would be added. Owens said, "None of them served for glory though they did serve for the freedom that makes us who we are."

Guest speaker, the Honorable Steve L. Muro, Under Secretary for Memorial Affairs, National Cemetery Administration, said, "These veterans never thought that one day their remains would be unclaimed. The

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first National Cemeteries were opened 150 years ago, and now they will be here forever. Every headstone tells a story. Please take time to thank those in uniform whenever you see them. And remember, we are borrowing this land from our future generations."

A moment of silence, a rifle salute, and Taps followed. Don Reid, another MIAP supporter, read all the names along with their branch of service. Rev. Sirginson gave the benediction, reminding everyone of the tradition of leaving a coin at the veteran's gravesite. Leaving a coin means that someone has visited and wanted to pay their respects.

McColley gave closing remarks followed by Yetter's rendition of Amazing Grace.

The urns were then solemnly marched to the individual gravesites and placed in the graves, marking the close of the service.

The Missing in America Project, Veteran Recovery Program works to



locate, identify, and inter the unclaimed cremated remains of American veterans through the joint efforts of private, state and federal organizations. At the same time, the project works to provide honor and respect to those who have served this country by securing a final resting place for those forgotten heroes.

During the service, Salisbury resident Lucille Baity was presented with a folded American flag. Her son, Stacey Lynn Mullis, is interred in the cemetery. Baity donated a large wreath to honor the veterans interred Saturday. She said, "My son died last year, and I miss him every day. He has only been gone a year, but each time I visit his gravesite, I leave another piece of my heart here."

Noting the large crowd on hand, Baity continued, "Getting the flag in the service was one of the proudest moments of my life. I am so thankful to everyone who attended. Just look at all of us. It was such a beautiful service." Baity went on to tell that her son was a jet mechanic in the US Air Force, serving for 12 years.

Veterans can be buried free of charge in National Cemeteries. Salisbury National Cemetery Program Support Director Allie Gennusa said, "We were honored to have this service here today. The bodies were collected at a funeral home in Greenville, NC and transported here. Each veteran's remains can get \$10,000 worth of free services. Scheduling is done from St. Louis, Missouri. We have funerals here Monday through Friday, every hour on the hour, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.."

The remains interred today were part of an extensive three month planning process. It was all finalized today when the tag on each urn was verified at the hearse, on the table and again before interment. The tag includes the name, date of interment, and other required information. Gennusa said, "We have a staff of 12 that worked tirelessly for two weeks to make this day of honor perfect. We want people to know that we are here and that our services are available."

Members of the Patriot Guards were on hand as well. With about 8,000 members in North Carolina, the Patriot Guards exist primarily to attend funerals of fallen heroes, both veterans and service workers such as police or fire personnel. State Captain Keith Arbuckle said, "For homeless vets, we are their family. We want to give honor and respect with dignity. Especially for veterans without family, what we do makes a difference." Arbuckle wanted to let people know that Dignity Memorial exists. Dignity Memorial is a network of funeral, cremation, and cemetery service providers that assists with preparation, coffin and transportation for unclaimed veterans.

Others who had a part in the transportation of the remains or the ceremony on Saturday were Rouse Mortuary Service and Crematory of Greenville, North Carolina National Guard Military Honors Funeral Program, Rowan County Veterans Honor Guard, Pitt County Sheriff's Office and the Greenville Police Department. Rolling Thunder and various historical military vehicles were on hand also.

Lucille Baity said, "Everybody needs somebody to care. These are our heroes. They deserve this chance of peace and rest."



"Christianity isn't "

So, last time we discussed the question, "What is Christianity?" The last two articles I've written present a biblical perspective for answering this question. There are many things that Christianity is- there are certain 'marks' or 'characteristics' that indicate the presence of authentic Christianity in a person or group of persons, the church. Most of these are readily obvious, but in today's world, Christianity means a thousand different things to a thousand different people. So for clarity's sake, here (again) are the marks of authentic, biblical Christianity I've given previously.

Real Christianity is:

1)...not by works but by faith.

2)...not by a thin intellectual knowledge of Jesus Christ but by daily trust in Him as Savior.

3)...not by religion, but by a relationship with God.

4)...not 'fire insurance' but real repentance.

5)...not ceremonial but spiritual.

6)...not coerced but motivated by desire and delight.

7)...not self-centered but others oriented.

8)...not judgmentalism that looks down on sinners, but shows others mercy.

9)...not satisfied with the pleasures and treasures of this world, but the infinitely greater pleasures and treasures of God and His eternal kingdom.

10)...not legalism but all grace.

So that's what real Christianity is. On the other hand, sometimes it's helpful to tell what something is by what it is not (notice how I began each of the above 'marks' with 'is not...but...'?). To

be sure, there are many other things that Christianity is not- and probably, there's too many to list here. So, here's a short list of what real Christianity most certainly isn't:

Authentic Christianity is not a cult or place that considers outsiders second-class, nor is it a kind of get-rich-quick scheme or system for advancing wealth or social standing. It's not a past, personal event or even a point-in-time decision written on a Bible cover or engraved on a trophy or plaque.

Biblical Christianity isn't a particular version of the Bible, nor is it a particular flavor of music- whether traditional or contemporary, hymns or choruses. It's not a one-hour pastime to be endured on Sunday mornings only, nor a fraternity for advancing humanitarian causes.

Real Christianity isn't a club or social organization, and it's certainly not a denomination or ecclesiastical organization or affiliation or coalition. It's not a place to 'pay your dues to God' on Sundays or even a place to put your extra cash so you can get a year-end tax break from Uncle Sam.

Genuine Christianity isn't a gift or service memorial dedicated to saints of old, nor is it a place to donate your unwanted furniture or sentimental nick-nacks.

True Christianity isn't a worship-by-yourself-at-home system you can do alone with your favorite radio / TV preacher, nor it is a certain style of building or place or structure.

Real, authentic Christianity is described reliably and most accurately in God's Word, the Bible, and recorded in the ancient pages of church history. The reason this conversation must exist is because there is confusion over what Christianity is.

But the truth is, there's very little confusion among true Christians- the confusion has come from the outside, not the inside. And while no one has it down just right, self included, I'm thankful Jesus got it right where I didn't, and that because of Him and His atoning sacrifice and perfect life, I can now, by a life of repentance from sin and faith in Jesus Christ, have the anti-Christian odor I was born with fully removed, and the Christ-like aroma of forgiveness and acceptance permeating my entire being both now and forever.

Praise Jesus Christ the Lord God Almighty!



For many, of whom I have often told you and now tell you even with tears, walk as enemies of the cross of Christ. Their end is destruction, their god is their belly, and they glory in their shame, with minds set on earthly things. But our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ. Philippians 3:18-20

Some time ago I heard of a lady who wrote a letter to her local newspaper. And lest you wonder, this story is not made up. This is the sum and substance of what she said:

"I am heartily sick of the type of religion that insists my soul (and everyone else's) needs saving -- whatever that means." She said, "I have never felt that I was lost. Nor do I feel that I wallow in the mire of sin" "Give me practical religion that teaches gentleness and kindness and acknowledges no barriers of color or creed, that remembers the aged and teaches children about goodness and not about sin."

Then she concluded,

"If, in order to save my soul, I must accept such a philosophy as I have recently heard preached, I prefer to remain forever damned."

Think about those words for a moment. I can find no statement in Scripture which has such disregard for the Deity, such disrespect for the Savior. Even worse, I am afraid this woman is not alone. Granted, not many are so bold, so blunt, so foolhardy to express their feelings in such a way, but she is not alone.

Pseudo-scholars make mockery of the Savior's sacrifice and elevate man's wisdom over God's salvation; elected leaders call upon Christ's Name to collect votes, but they deny knowing Him when they cast theirs; so-called stars scoff openly at the Savior, but their lives appear destitute of meaning.

Think of those words: "I prefer to remain forever damned." Christians must shed tears for any nation whose citizenry believes that it has, without God, created itself and wishes to be in complete control of its future. We shed tears for any of our neighbors who feel they can live their lives secure in sin, safe from any final accounting. Christians cry tears and pray that all who, this day, are enemies of the cross, may soon be Spirit-led to see the Savior, His cross, and empty tomb. May they see in Him there is salvation.

The lady may prefer she be forever damned; but I pray that she may, in Jesus, be forever saved.

Let us pray, and work, and witness so this lady and all those like her may be turned from being enemies of the cross and be led to the Savior. May they see His sacrifice, His thorn-encircled head, the love and blood that poured from His wounds.

Let us pray, and work, and witness so that she, along with the doubters and the deniers, the skeptics and the cynics, the unbelievers and the unsaved will take a good look into the Savior's empty tomb. By God's grace may they see the living Lord and, with repentant hearts, fall to their knees and with a reborn, Spirit-given heart say, "My Lord and my God!" (See John 20:24-28.)

Let us pray, and work, and witness so their transformation from damnation to salvation may bring a smile to the Savior's face.

A smile on Jesus' face: that is something that would be worth seeing.

THE PRAYER: Dear Lord, the world is filled with sinful souls who think they can come up with a better plan for salvation than You have in Jesus. Forgive them and grant to them a heart that acknowledges their sin and the Savior's perfection. This I ask for all who, this day, are lost. In Jesus' Name. Amen.
