28th Sunday Ordinary Year B Mark 10:17-30 SELL EVERYTHING YOU HAVE GIVE TO THE POOR.

"As Jesus was setting out on a journey, a man ran up, knelt down before him, and asked him, "Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus answered him, "Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: You shall not kill; you shall not commit adultery; you shall not steal; you shall not bear false witness; you shall not defraud; honor your father and your mother." He replied and said to him, "Teacher, all of these I have observed from my youth." Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said to him, "You are lacking in one thing. Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." At that statement his face fell, and he went away sad, for he had many possessions. Jesus looked around and said to his disciples, "How hard it is for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God!" The disciples were amazed at his words. So Jesus again said to them in reply, "Children, how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for one who is rich to enter the kingdom of God." They were exceedingly astonished and said among themselves, "Then who can be saved?" Jesus looked at them and said, "For human beings it is impossible, but not for God. All things are possible for God." Peter began to say to him, "We have given up everything and followed you." Jesus said, "Amen, I say to you, there is no one who has given up house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or lands for my sake and for the sake of the gospel who will not receive a hundred times more now in this present age: houses and brothers and sisters and mothers and children and lands, with persecutions, and eternal life in the age to come."

Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

28th Sunday Ordinary Year B

Mark 10:17-30

Do you remember Mr Miyagi from the Karate Kid movie, saying, "First Learn, Stand, Then Learn, Fly. Nature Rule, Daniel-san, Not Mine." Mr Miyagi was teaching Daniel humility by demonstrating humility himself, (not claiming any special wisdom for himself), yet also reminding Daniel that as a student he had much progress still to make learning the basics first. Or keeping in mind a version of what Forest Gump says, "Goodness is as goodness does!", Jesus in today's gospel similarly puts a presumptuous and wealthy young man in his place, by first humbly deflecting the man's flattery and then challenging him to truly advance to the next level if he really felt he was ready to advance. Recall that the young man asked "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" (Mk 10:17) He wants to spiritually progress, and to accomplish the next stage of maturity in spirit. The rich young man comes to Jesus seeking excellence and eternal life. In response, Jesus simply challenges him to examine his motivation and internal state of soul, instead of being fixated on social position and being too caught up in his comforts and self-satisfaction. After Jesus listed off moral commandments and material to work on, the young man boldly claimed that he had long ago mastered them already, as if saying, "I'm beyond that-I am no beginner." So, Jesus seems to say, 'Okay then, it sounds like you are ready for 'black diamond ski slope-the more difficult" (when I was a kid racing bicycles in the NBL, this was like advancing from the 'novice' runs to the 'expert' runs—though ask me sometime about the real story, why even when we could beat the experts, we still never wanted to advance to their class!)

Jesus emphasizes the need for the young man to check his arrogance and pride, and the real turning point in this story, comes when we hear Jesus slow everything down by offering two pauses in His response. Mark 10:21 says that "Jesus, 1)looking at him, 2) loved him and (then) said" You are lacking in one thing. Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor." Jesus 1)looked at him and 2) loved Him, before speaking to Him. These pauses and the loving glance of Jesus to the student, reminds me of the look of compassion a chef may give an ambitious assistant who boasts about handling the heat (it doesn't bother me) as the chef goes ahead and gives him a 'ghost pepper' to bite into! I am sure the chef looks with loving pity upon his student who is about to learn he's really 'not ready' yet. It is as if Jesus gently pierces the young man's pride by saying, "Since you have mastered the commandments, now advance to moral master status, by going and selling all you have to give it to the poor...." Knowing Jesus and that He provides all we need, we know that the young man would in fact be gaining everything" with such a move, but apparently the man is not as advanced as he CLAIMS, and the gospel says he walked away deflated (Mk 10:22) The story invite sus to consider, "Are we at that level of discipleship? Could we master such a detachment from material possessions?" If not, then we have to work to do. What about our possessions-are they holding us back from following Jesus more faithfully? What can we do to loosen their grip over us? (it may begin with us honestly and humbly acknowledging that they own us, not we own them-we serve them, not they serving us-in fact if they are higher priority than God, then they are an 'idol'!)

A first place in determining the power our possessions may have over us, is to ask yourself the question that we kids used to play a game with, asking each other, "If you were stranded on an island and could only have one of possessions, what would it be?" The game sought to have you identify the material possession that you most prized and felt you couldn't live without. I was always hesitant to publicly announce my heart's treasure (as if God didn't already know!) because I suspected that as soon as I did identify it, then, that 'idol' of mine is what God would ask of me to sacrifice! Well, in a way, that is exactly what happens, because anything that we prize higher than God, it is going to let us down, and impede us from growing in relationship to God who is our true happiness. Apparently, the young man in the gospel has many 'idols' that need sacrificing, before He can truly know Jesus. They prevent him from following Jesus. We can certainly learn from the 'saddened' young man, to ask ourselves, "What are the 'idols' in my life that keep me from God?" Peace, Fr Brian
