around" and find those hidden gifts from the Lord. And then, when we find them...use them.


We might have to throw some things out of our lives to find them (pride, greed, envy, strife, lying, etc), but the Lord will bless you and use you.

He was especially excited and touched. Several people wanted us to come to their churches some Also, as we were about to leave, a man told Joey "Pray for me - I gotta get saved!" Joey did so, and the guy was gloriously born again...Hallelujah!!

Friday afternoon and all day Saturday we went all over the downtown area, seeing all the sights and the things honoring Andy Griffith and the show, including the Andy Griffith Museum, and some replicas of things on the show, and a big parade on Saturday. Andy was born and raised in Mt. Airy. What a super weekend we had.

On Monday, the 29th, we went to Charlotte, North Carolina and went thru the Billy Graham Museum/Library. It was awesome, especially the
