DESCRIPTION: The Shakespeare Cascade was one of the most expensive and highest performing short bows ever designed. When Shakespeare asked Ernie Root to design a short bow that was considerably better than the Bear Super Magnum 48, he designed the Cascade. Ernie wasn't fond of short bows, so he used a heavy phenolic riser to give the bow weight and shock absorption. He used exceptionally wide limbs (2.5") to increase speed, reduce stack, and distribute the shot stress over a much larger area. This is a great looking and performing recurve. Very comfortable grip. Bow has no delamination; no cracks; limbs are straight. Beveled arrow shelf. Overlays and tips are in great condition. No drilled holes; No chips, dings or cracks. No crazing or stress cracks; a few of very faint superficial stress lines in the riser fade-out. A few minor scratches and nicks here and there. Decals are in very good shape. Some wear to the limbs. Overall, this is a really nice bow in excellent condition for its age. This bow sold for \$105 in 1969, which translates to \$798.00 in 2022 inflation adjusted dollars. Comes with a new string.

An engineering first! The Cascade has 2½" wide limbs—a full ½" wider than other hunting bows. This extra width distributes the stress over a wider area which, for the first time, allows a limb design of a bow 14" larger. This means more speed (up to 33½% faster) less stick and smoother draw than any other bow of this length. The Cascade is built of jet-age material with a black formica handle riser and special black fiberglass face and back. This 50" black beauty also has the new Shakespeare Hunter arrow rest and comes with the String Ease bow stringer, an "ABC's of Archery" booklet, and a subscription to Archery World magazine.
