Railway Bridge is Being Rebuilt

You may not even know it's there, but this major bridge in the Colonies is being rebuilt.

CRANDIC bridge I-142 (that's its bridge identity number) crosses the lowa River south of Middle Amana a couple miles west of Highway 151. It's on the busy "Main Line" near the South Amana Rail Terminal.

As Matt Perkins, project manager and CRAN-DIC spokesperson, explained in an email, "This 19-mile-line is used as a direct interchange connection between CRANDIC and the IAIS." About 177,000 rail cars travel on this line each year, he explained.

"This line is a major artery for the CRANDIC as well as the Cedar Rapids based companies it serves. 75% of the traffic moved by CRANDIC flows up and down this line. To lose this line would cripple not only CRANDIC but also some major industries in the Cedar Rapids area," Perkins added.

The bridge was built by the American Bridge Co. of New York in 1902, by the owner of the line at that time, the Milwaukee Road.

As Perkins told us, the foundations of the bridge are starting to deteriorate and in general, it needed to be replaced to accommodate today's heavier train loads. The entire bridge is being replaced with all new foundations and structural steel spans.

It will take about 1 year to do all the work. Work began this summer, so by the end of July or early August next year it should be done. It is being done by Kraemer America- National Railroad Group of Eau Claire, Wisconsin.

How does one replace a railroad bridge? The goal is to keep the rail line open and the trains running. So the existing bridge will first be raised about 27 inches so that a new foundation can be built below it. During that time new steel spans will be placed on a support structure. By working underneath and alongside the old bridge will remain open for use for most of the project.

Once the foundations are complete and the steel spans are built, they demolish the old bridge and roll the new steel spans into place onto the new foundation using hydraulic rams and heavy-duty rollers. "We anticipate this operation will be complete in about one year," CRANIDIC reported.



Homestead Folk Art Museum To Open

The new Homestead Folk Art Museum at the former Homestead General Store is being created right now by the Amana Heritage Museum

Jon Childers, Amana Heritage Society Executive Director, reports that a "soft opening" for Amana residents will be set for one day in December with the new museum opening to the public next spring.

With about 6,000 square feet of exhibit and work space, the goal is to exhibit Amana art and trade arts; objects made during Amana's communal, post-communal and contemporary period. Contemporary fine art, particularly paintings and prints, created after 1940 will be highlighted along with objects created in the textile arts, furniture building, metalwork, broom and basketmaking.

A 12-month long inventory of the collection that was stored in the building has been undertaken by Rebecca Simpson, museum curator, and her team members.

In addition, the former store, used most recently as an event space by Die Heimat, needed interior remodeling so that it could be used to exhibit objects. Some space in the building will be used for special or rotating exhibits and the kitchen area will be suitable for classes or workshops. Finally having space for special, new exhibits and to show objects that were donated decades ago but have not been shown will be

"Just having the space to show what we have is neat," Childers said. Then they hope to add classes and workshops one day.

"The Amana Arts Guild does a great job with so many art classes and workshops. We envision areas where we can help provide classes or talks to our members and local residents in other areas . . we could do how-to's in restoration work like how to fix old windows or how -tos relating to restoration. And then there are traditional crafts that could be taught as well. We would like to offer things that fill a need here," Childers notes. "That's what we be exploring in future."

The exhibits will "tell Amana's story through it's objects," as Childers said. In many ways Amana craftsmen built to suit, creating objects as needed to fulfill specific needs. But then there are some amazing pieces of furniture of metal work or needlework, quilting and lace work, that are one of a kind.

Being able to share and show off these pieces will be an opportunity to tell Amana's story in a new way. "We have such wonderful collections to share with the public, to engage people of all ages and all walks of life. Our hope is that our new museum will open doors to new ideas . . . " Simpson wrote about the new site.
