

MISSION FOCUS

Many thanks to all of you who donated to our monthly mission projects. Your participation helps our congre-



gation to be the hands of Christ to the world.

Drum roll please! In August, you donated \$835 to purchase winter wear for the children at Bdecan; and in October, while Pastor Cathie and Dr. Carrie were in Kenya, you donated \$3,565 to the feeding program for students at the Mpangua school there. That total includes \$1,500 in matching funds from two individuals in the congregation.

Our November project was the New Life Center. We recently learned that several churches who were supporters of the ministry there have had to withdraw their support. The Mission/Outreach and Evangelism Committee decided that we would attempt to fill that void by continuing with New Life Center as our December focus. In addition to the clothing items listed in the November newsletter, they are also in need of cold & flu meds (alcohol-free capsules), allergy meds (Zyrtec & ClaritinD), combs, dental floss, disposable razors, twin extra-long fitted sheets, standard white pillowcases, pillows, towels & washcloths (white), deodorant, foot powder, acid reducers & melatonin, soy sauce & basil.

Any of these items, and many others will help these children of God, so valuable in God's eyes, get back on their feet. In a similar vein, our Mission Focus for January will again be Open Doors 65. They provide a drop-in center and free "thrift store" for homeless people on Main Avenue in downtown Fargo. They have a limited amount of space to currently accept in-kind donations, but funds are always needed to pay rent and utilities. If they are in need of physical items in January, we will announce it in worship and send out an email blast.

Thank you again for your missionmindedness throughout the year.
