DRIPPING SPRINGS, TEXAS – Beginning AUGUST 8, 2018, the Dr. Pound Historical Farmstead will present “*Invasión Yanqui: The U.S.-Mexican War, 1846–1848*,” an exhibit by Humanities Texas, the state affiliate of the National Endowment for the Humanities.

This exhibition examines the war between Mexico and the United States that erupted in 1846 over territory covering a half-million square miles. The outcome of this war determined the size, shape and wealth of the two nations, marking the beginning of a unique Mexican-American culture.

“*Invasión Yanqui*” uses paintings, lithographs, sketches, letters, diaries, sheet music, print documents and artifacts from museums and libraries in both the United States and Mexico to narrate the story of the U.S.-Mexican War.

The exhibition will be available to the public from August 8, 2018 to September 5, 2018.
