It is January 18th as I am writing this. Brrrr...I was beginning to think we were going to skip winter this year but Mother Nature has decided we need a little snow and cold in Ohio. I love snow, so I am enjoying this right now. Remember to check on fellow seniors, make sure they are staying warm or just a "how are you doing" call. Winter can be a very lonely time.

It's back, we are starting slow, but bingo will be back the first Wednesday of each month, starting February 6th. Although the Saturday bingos in 2018 weren't a huge success, we wanted to give Wednesday evening bingo another try. This is an important source of revenue for the center and one of the reasons we cut back was because we were losing money instead of making it. The board has decided to give it another try, so we'll see how it goes. We have received several calls, I hope that's a good sign. Please spread the word and join us.

So last year at this time I shared a big dream of mine, paying off the mortgage early. No we haven't yet, but we are making some progress, our balance is \$520,000. I know that sounds like a lot but when I started here we were just under the \$1 million mark. So once again, I'll do a little begging, anytime you would like to make a donation to the center toward that cause or remembering us in your estate planning, we would sincerely appreciate it. Let me share the steps we have taken on this quest, the first year I was here, 2014, I contacted the bank and we did a rate reduction, an almost 2% reduction in the rate; huge. We kept paying the same payment amount, so that helps reduce even more the amount of interest we are paying the bank and big chunks out of the principal. Last year we increased the amount we are paying, just a little, remember we are on a very tight budget, but every little bit helps. Finally, also last year, we had a very generous member donate \$20,000, which we applied directly to the principal. The actual maturity date is October 2025, but I really hope to take a couple years off that. There is so much we could do, more services we could offer, if only we didn't have to make that mortgage payment every month. No, I'm not too proud to beg a little on the centers behalf. Thank you for your continued support of the center.

Thank you for the laughter I hear every day and thank you to everyone that helps at the center everyday!

In the Kitchen with Joanna

February 5 is the celebration of Chinese New Year. We are entering the year of the Pig. In Chinese culture the Pig represents wealth and is the last symbol of the Chinese Zodiac.

Chow Mein

- $1\frac{1}{2}$ pounds of round steak, cut into small bite size pieces.
- 3 boneless pork chops, cut into small bite size pieces.
- 2 medium size onions
- 4-5 ribs of celery
- 2 15 oz. cans of bean sprouts (or fresh sprouts)
- 1 can of sliced water chestnuts
- 1 can of sliced bamboo shoots
- 1 head of Bok Choy, or Napa Cabbage, or Regular Green Cabbage
- ¹/₂ cup of low sodium soy sauce
- ¹/₂ cup of white corn syrup
- ¹/₂ cup of chicken broth
- 2 tablespoons of corn starch

Cut onions coarsely, cut celery in diagonal slices. Brown meat, onions and celery in 2 tablespoons of olive oil, when browned add the bean sprouts, bamboo shoots, water chestnuts and cabbage that has been chopped. Add a shot of soy sauce and cook mixture for about 5 minutes or until tender. Mix in a bowl the ½ cup of soy sauce, chicken broth, corn syrup and corn starch, mixing well until starch is dissolved. Pour over the meat and vegetable mixture and stir. When the liquid mixture has thickened it is ready to serve over rice or Chinese rice noodles.
