## Men's Services

Men are visiting spas now more than ever, driven by the same pampering that attracts women plus the awareness that good grooming makes good sense and can be an advantage – in the boardroom and the bedroom.

While manicures have long been popular with men, more guys are receiving pedicures as well, many spa owners say. Hair removal is also a service popular with men.

"We do a lot of backs and chests," says Sherri Williams, an esthetician at The Pink Papaya in Fayetteville. "We also do men's brows, which can make a huge difference in appearance and really bring out the eyes. We don't want them to be so groomed that they are 'pretty,' but you can keep them from looking too bushy."

Patty Kulish of White Lotus Fayetteville agrees. "Lots of men are asking for waxing," she says. "I call it 'man-scaping,' and it can make a huge difference."

Men are also seeking anti-aging treatments such as facials and good skin care products, and many companies have created lines that cater to men with masculine scents and packaging.

More men are also discovering the more technologically advanced ways that women combat appearance flaws. Ashley Spurlock of WellQuest Spa in Bentonville points out that many gentlemen have found LipoDissolve—most commonly used on women, particularly in the abdomen area—to be an effective remedy for the dreaded "man boobs" that cannot always be countered with diet and exercise.
