BASS TOURNAMENT A SUCCESS

The Hague Chamber of Commerce is more than pleased by the positive reaction of the community and the Chamber members during the B.A.S.S. tournament June 25-27. Larry Allard of West Brookfield, MA won the first prize of \$1,000 with a five-fish catch totaling 12 pounds, 8 oz. Second place winner was Larry Parker of Rochester and John Barrows won the \$400unker prize for his 3 lb. 14 oz. bass. 91 anglers caught 328 bass totaling 551 lbs.
