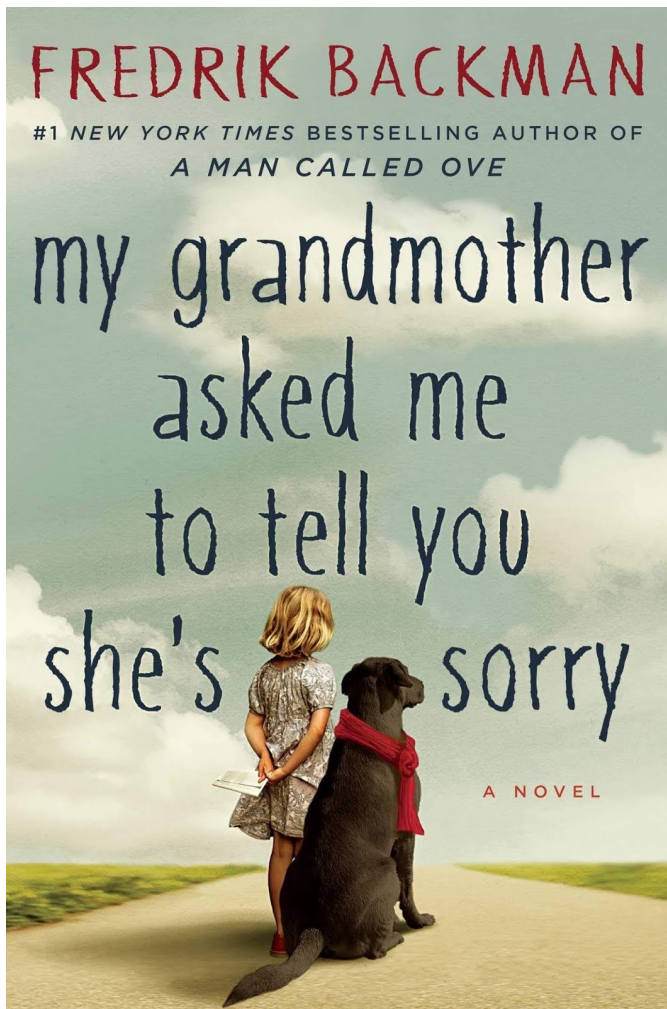

Everyone is welcome to join book club discussions on the fourth Tuesday of the month. We are meeting on **August 27 at 1:30 pm** at Margaret Deveraux Jefferies' house (262 NE 18th Ave, Hillsboro). Our backup location is Calvary's library.

You do not need to have finished the book to join the discussion. Just be aware that often the questions have spoilers. Please feel free to join us for fellowship if you haven't read the book.

August's humorous fiction book is ***My Grandmother Asked Me to Tell You She's Sorry, a Novel*** by Frederick Backman. This warmhearted novel is about love, forgiveness, and the right to be different. It is told from the candid and insightful point of view of a precocious seven year old girl observing adult behavior. When Elsa's beloved, crazy, story-telling grandma dies and leaves behind a series of letters apologizing to people she has wronged, Elsa's greatest adventure begins. Along the way, she learns more about her grandmother's life and the lives of people influenced by her grandmother. Katherine will lead the discussion. The public library has 15 book copies, 5 large print books, 5 Audiobook CD sets, 7 downloadable Audiobooks, and 5 eBooks.

Updates from Council

August Summer greetings!

Thank you, Calvary family, for your generous spirit. You answered a request for help with meeting our financial needs. A few other steps have been taken to reduce Calvary's monthly financial footprint. The cleaning services have been cut to Friday only, cutting the cost from \$400 to \$250 per week. We will try this through September and re-evaluate if one cleaning per week will be enough. The thermostats have been programmed to run according to the time and area of the church that each group is using. Quarterly payment such as Brotherhood Mutual Insurance have been renegotiated to be paid monthly. Pastor Rachel has encouraged the council to look for revenue beyond the traditional offering plate. We will be sharing our ideas with you in the coming months. If you have ideas, we welcome your input.

Property team: Members have been busy working on the exterior grounds and building. Areas of peeling paint have been prepped and primed, weeds have been pulled, shrubs trimmed, flower beds watered, and grass/dandelions mowed.

The semi-annual HVAC service was in July. Regular maintenance and service call found an issue with the Welcome Room unit. A repair was needed (condenser motor and capacitor). When the technician came to put in the new parts, he discovered that the fan also needed to be replaced. The initial cost was \$2,074.07, plus the additional \$578.78 totaling \$2,652.85. \$1500 has been donated toward these repairs leaving a balance due of \$1,152.85.

Current mortgage balance: \$10,136.97, as of 8/6/24.

Council did a walkthrough of the building to see how it was currently being used and to assess where there might be potential for change. We also reorganized our traditional committees down to four areas that we felt were most important at this time and assigned a council member as the point person to each. Worship – Leslie Rabon; Property – Dennis White; Congregational Care – Sophia Earl and Carol Dougall; Community Care – Anita Hiebel

Safety & Security during worship: In the past, our church council had begun working on a safety plan. We are reviewing it and checking with other Hillsboro churches to see what sort of plan they use. The Hillsboro Police will also be contacted to see what suggestions they have for churches and businesses in the area. Gratitude for Zoom ministry: Over time several people have shared their appreciation for Calvary's Zoom ministry. Whether they attend online due to current or ongoing health issues or family caregiving or even while on vacation, Zoom has been available to them. Personally, I appreciate the grace the online community shows me when we experience technical difficulties.

As Calvary moves forward, let us be reminded that God formed us with a purpose: to create, to serve, to tend, to protect, and to love.
