

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Info from the Commission

Repairing Open-Loop Geothermal Wells and Pump Systems

In the past couple of years, the Well Drillers Commission has worked with the Plumbers Examining Board to clarify and address a conflict between the standards for open-loop geothermal wells in the Well Drillers rules and the prohibition of the discharge of wastewater into a source of potable water in the Internal Plumbing Rules. The Internal Plumbing Rules are clear, any wastewater leaving a structure, regardless of its source or strength, cannot be discharged into a well that also serves as a source of drinking water. The result of this conclusion is that "duel use" open-loop geothermal wells do not meet current standards in Maine, and never have regardless of the standards found in the Well Drillers Rules. Geothermal wastewater cannot be discharged into a drinking water well. No new systems configured this way should be installed.

A driller was asked to repair an existing duel use open-loop system and was concerned about potential liability now that these wells have been determined to not meet "code". The Commission discussed the issue at length and concluded that the system should be repaired and the driller or pump installer repairing the well or pump system should notify the owner in writing that the current configuration of the geothermal system does not meet current standards in Maine and that in the future the property owner will need to have a second well installed for return water to bring the system up to current requirements. The current legal status of the system should not preclude a driller or pump installer from restoring the heat source of a property because the system requires a return well.

This issue will be addressed in the next rulemaking which should take place sometime in 2018. A bill passed last year requires the Commission to amend the rules and include a requirement for drillers to distribute water quality and testing information to each customer. The Department's Toxicology Division will help draft the handout – they already have similar handouts. There will be opportunities during the rulemaking for input concerning all of these issues from licensees and the Maine Ground Water Association.
